

Remarks On Board Bark Northern Light Of
Sunday Oct- 25th 1868

Commenced with fresh bases
and hazy from the Eastward. Hazy off
ends with strong bases from the
East. Saw a shoal of sperm
whales and took one, got him
to the ship but he sunk so
heavy we had to let him go.
Lat 25-26 S
Long 175-13 W

Monday Oct- 26th
Strong bases and roused from
the E. Ends with strong bases
and roused from E. Employed a
cutting the whale very much

Tuesday Oct 27th
Commenced strong bases
and roused both in the Boarding
had to let the head, lay down
not get it in being roused
and it sunk very heavy
ends with strong bases and roused
from S.E. took the junk off the
base sunk so bad can't get a
hole in it started the works

Wednesday Oct 28th
Strong bases and rain from
S.E. boiling middle fresh bases and
fine weather ends fine haze up the
base and bailed it - 8 o'clock

Thursday Oct 29th 1868

Commenced with a fresh. Sale
from S.E. at 2 pm heavy rain
storm had to cool down. Started at
9 again. Ends fine weather finished
boiling. Lat 25-53 S
Long 175-17 W

Friday Oct 30th
Commenced with light-ases
and rousing to S. Ends with fine
weather. Wind rousing to the Eastward
Employed Coopering Oil
Lat
Long

Saturday 31st
Commenced with thick haze
from the Eastward Coopering Oil
Ends with fine weather from the South
Employed Stowing Oil in the main hatch
Lat 25-12 S
Long

Sunday Nov 1st
Commenced with fresh bases
and fine weather from the South
Ends with fresh bases and haze from
S.E. Lat 25-02 S
Long

Monday Nov 2nd
Commenced with fresh bases and
hazy from S.E. Ends with haze
from S.E. Lat
Long

Tuesday Nov 3rd
Commenced with moderate bases
and thick haze from S.E. Course S.W.
Ends with thick and haze from E. Course
S.W. Lat
