Tuesday Feb 16th 1869

Commenced with a strong
Sail from W and veering to S.W.
Ended with a fresh Sail from S.W.
and a heavy sea running

Wednesday Feb 17th
Commenced with fog and
rugged weather from the S heading
to the Westward. Ended with strong
breezes and squalls from the Eastward
Heading off N.E. Lat 31° 08' S
Long 79° 50' W

Thursday Feb 18th

Commenced with strong
breezes from E.S.E. with squally weather
Ended with strong breezes and rugged
from the Eastward

Friday Feb 19th

Commenced with strong breezes
from the Eastward Employed repairing
the fore sail. Ended with strong breezes
from E.S.E. Saw a bark to windward
Belling

Saturday Feb 20th

Commenced with strong
breezes from E.S.E. just at the set
Saw a Whale towed 2 Boats. Saw
him no more. Ended with strong
breezes and rugged. Saw a bark
making land 4 Boats high.
a Whal. Saw the bark Napoleon
of New Bedford

no chance

Wednesday Feb 21st 1869

Strong breeze from the East.
took the Whal and left him in
at dusk. Ended with a fresh Sail
from the East cleared away the head
and started the Works

Monday Feb 22nd

Commenced with a strong
Sail Boiled the Head Boiled
down at 4 P.M. Ended with a
strong Sail from E.S.E. at 7 am
started the Works

Tuesday Feb 23rd

Commenced with a strong
Sail from E.S.E. Employed a
boiling. Ended the same boiler down
at midnight. Lat

Wednesday Feb 24th

Commenced with a fresh Sail
from E.S.E. heading to the S.E. West-
Sail. Ended with a moderate Sail
Employed blowing down oil

Thursday Feb 25th

Commenced with a moderate
Sail from E.S.E. heading E.S.E. Employed
wrapping ship. Ended strong breezes and
hazy

Friday Feb 26th

Commenced strong breezes and
hazy from E.S.E. Sailed with
the Senia. Ended with a strong Sail
from E.S.E. with raining
