Saturday Feb 27th 1869

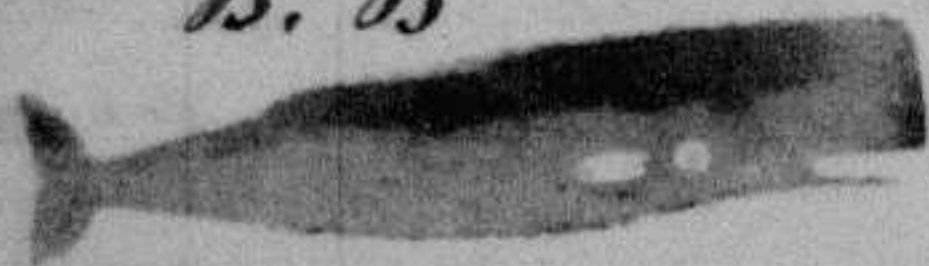
Commenced with a strong
Sail from E.N.E. from E. with a good
wing Main top sail. Ends with a
strong Sail from E.N.E. with rain
No Obs

Sunday Feb 28th
Commenced with a strong
Sail and a heavy E. wind at
1 P.M. veering to the E.N.W. thick and
raining. Ends the same strong Sail
from W. Lat 33.28 S
Long 179.17 E

Monday March 1st
Commenced with a strong
Sail and a clear from W.N.W. Lat a
clear reefed Main top sail. Ends with
heavy with frequent rain squalls from S.W.
Lat 33.00 S
Long 179.09 E

Tuesday March 2nd
Commenced with fine weather
from S.W. watches employed at
various jobs. Ends with fresh breezes
and fine weather from W.N.W. at
6.39 am saw a sperm whale
lowered 3 Boats took one head
the B.B. three and Mrs. Harvins
just layed him up

Fine weather. Putt in the
Boards of the Whale spoke & planters
of Wobartown. Ends with strong
breeze employed a boiling

Commenced fine weather
Squally. Ends fine like the
Emma & Jones employed boiling
Lat
Long

Friday March 5th
Commenced with fine
weather and light breeze. Saw
the Span. Bark Chacery. Whales
lowered 4 Boats without success
Middle and latter light breeze and
calms finished boiling at midnight
Lat 33.09 S
Long

Saturday March 6th
Commenced calm. Sailed
with the Emma & Jones. Ends with
light baffling breeze employed stowing
Oil in the After Hatch
Lat 33.22 S
Long 179.09 E

Sunday March 7th
Commenced with fine weather
and light baffling breeze and sail
in light. Ends calm
Lat 32.58 S
Long

Monday March 8th
Commenced with light breeze
from the Eastward. Steary off W.N.W.
Sailed with the Span. Bark
Ends with fine weather from E.N.E.
Steary off W and W by S in company
with the Span Bark
Lat
Long
