

Remarks On Board Bark Northern Light Off New
Friday April 23rd 1869

Commenced with strong breeze
from E.S.E. Saw Whale a few ways
to windward at 2 p.m. hauled 3 Bats
without success, chased till dark.
Ended with strong breeze and fine
weather from the Eastward. Saw 2 Sails

Commenced with strong breeze
from the Eastward at 4 p.m. fresh
Sail and dark cloudy. Ended with
a fresh S.E. from E.

Sunday April 25th

Commenced with a fresh S.E.
from E. West. Saw a Sail to windward.
Ended with a fresh S.E. from E.S.E.

Monday April 26th

Commenced with strong
breeze from E.S.E. Sailed with
the Esmanley of New Bedford
100 Lb 80 Whale. Ended with fresh
S.E. and rugged weather from E.S.E.

Tuesday April 27th

Commenced with fresh S.E.
from E.S.E. Ended the same fresh S.E.
and rain squalls

Wednesday April 28th

Commenced with a fresh S.E.
from E.S.E. here to be the E.S.E. West
Sail. Ended with strong breeze and heavy
fog from the North and veering to the West
West sail

Bedford Capt Michael Baker Master
Thursday April 29th 1869

Commenced with strong breeze
but clear weather from N.W. and
letting up the fore rigging. Ended with
a fresh S.E. and veering to the Westward
here to heading to the Westward
Lat 33.30 S

Commenced with the a fresh
S.E. from S.W. Ended the same breeze
and single reefed fore sails

Saturday May 1st

Commenced with a fresh S.E.
from S.W. hauled at 11 A.M. single
reefed fore sails. Ended with fresh breeze
and fine weather from S.W.

Sunday May 2nd

At 10 A.M. 24 hours fresh
breeze and fine weather from S.W.
Sailed with the Hunter. Saw a Whale
male. Hunt him till
him to the Hunter. Put off his
Position 30 miles ahead and directly in front and
30 miles S of
French Hook

Monday May 3rd

Commenced with fresh breeze
and fine weather. Saw 400000
and Goat Island Bay

Tuesday May 4th

Clear weather. Opened sails
by the wind. The Hunter in company.
