

Remarks On Board Bark Northern Light Of New
Thursday July 29th 1869

Commenced with strong trades
and squally from the Eastward. Close
reefed top sails and lower stay sails
commenced to overhaul foot ropes
on the main mast. Middle studding
sails from E. S. E. Course S. E. by E
all sail under light and way to
the S. E. Employed fitting foot ropes
Set -

Friday July 30th

Commenced with light
airs and fine weather from E. S. E.
Course S. E. all sail employed
fitting foot ropes. Middle studding
sails with light breezes and way to
the S. E.

Saturday July 31st

Commenced with fine
weather from S. E. by the wind to the
Eastward. Employed fitting foot
ropes. Middle studding sails
to East by the wind S. E. all sail

Sunday Aug 1st 1869

Commenced with squally
weather from E. with rain employed
washing ship. E. was with strong breezes
from E. Course S. E. by E. close reefed top
sails and courses. Set 20. 22. 4

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Monday Aug 2nd

Strong breezes from E. Course
S. E. by E. middle and outer studding
sails and way to the S. E. all sail
Course S. Capt Baker Lick

Bedford Capt Michael Baker Master
Tuesday Aug 3rd 1869

Commenced with strong squally
from all points of the compass.
Middle studding sails with fine weather
from the South. Set 21. 25. 5

Wednesday Aug 4th

Commenced with fine weather
from S. by the wind to the Westward.
Employed fitting foot ropes. Bubb
batter and on Deck. Courses with light
airs and Calms

Thursday Aug 5th

Commenced with light airs
and Calms. San. Humph. back
lowered. Boat without sweeps
employed on the rigging. Courses with
light airs and Calms.

Friday Aug 6th

Commenced with fresh breezes
and fine weather from the Eastward
at 3 p.m. San. a large fresh
breeze going to windward. quick
lowered 2 Boats. No chance of rain
till Dark. Courses with fresh breezes
and squally. Set 22. 47. 5

Saturday Aug 7th

Commenced with squally
rainy from E. S. E. Middle wind
veering to the East with rain.
Studding sails with variable
winds veering to the Southward
