

Remarks On Board Bark Northern Light

Thursday Mch 10th 1870

Commenced with fresh breezes
and fine weather from S.E.
4 sails in light - water calm
at various parts of ship's sides
ends with strong breezes from
E.S.E. opposite backs of the wind

Friday Mch 11th

Commenced with strong breezes
from E. by the wind first sail
ends with fine weather from the E
nothing in light - heavy to the S

Saturday Mch 12th

Commenced with fine weather
from N.E. saw 4 sails ends with
light airs from the Northward same
with the live oak

Sunday Mch 13th

Commenced with light airs
and calm ends the same
Lat 33.01 S
Long 179.26 E

Monday Mch 14th

Commenced with light
airs from the Northward same
E.S.E. ends calm

Tuesday Mch 15th

Commenced calm ends with
light airs and fine weather from
S.E. Course N.E. all sail - 3 sails
in light

Wednesday Mch 16th 1870

Commenced with fine weather
and light breezes from S.E. Course
N.E. ends with light breezes
and cloudy from the Southward

Thursday Mch 17th

Commenced with dark cloudy
from S and veary to S.E. at 7 pm
fresh sail and rain middle of day
ends with strong breezes from
E.S.E. heading to the S first sail
Lat 32.06 S
Long 179.45 W

Friday Mch 18th

Commenced with strong
breezes and cloudy from E.S.E. heading
to the S fine sail in light - middle
and latter fresh sails from E.S.E.

Saturday Mch 19th

Commenced with a fresh
sail and squally from E.S.E.
heading to the S explosion repairing
the fore end with strong
breezes and fine weather from
S.E. Lat 33.15 S

Sunday Mch 20th

Strong breeze from S.E. saw
a large long whale took him
L.B. had the fine part
twice got the whale to the
ship at midnight ends
parted twice with strong breezes commenced
battering the whale Lat 33.26 S
W.B. battery stove Long 178.47 E
