

Remarks On Board Bark Northern Light Of
Thursday March 31st 1870

Commenced with fine weather
from N.E. Course S.W. all fair
Ends with light airs and fine
weather from N.E. at 8 am. Saw
Cape Britt bearing S.E. by S

Friday April 1st

Commenced with light
airs from N.E. heading in for the
Bay at dark came in thick
and calm pulled off lights
and off shore. Middle fine
weather. Ends squally from
S.W. No chance to get in.

Saturday April 2nd

Commenced with a strong
breeze and squally tending off
to the Westward of the
Harbour close under the land.
Ends with fine weather from S.W.
Working up for the Bay.

Sunday April 3rd

Fine weather and a light
breeze from S.W. dropped anchor at
1 P.M. The Eliza came in at 5
Ends with fine weather.

Monday April 4th

Commenced with fine weather
Ends with strong breezes and squally
Employed getting provisions from the Cacca

Tuesday April 5th 1870

Strong breezes and bad weather
Employed stowing provisions and
filling water took by the hook of the
Casks 74 lbs Beef 38 lbs Sileas 2
Large Casks of Bread Ends with fine
weather took off 100 lbs of Water 3
Tons of Potatoes one Cask of Sails a
Ten Cans Onions &c &c

Wednesday April 6th

Commenced with fine weather
Employed stowing away got ready
for sea at 5 P.M. The Capt and
his family came off all ready
4th mate for sea
And John Middle Cabin Ends with light
breeze at 9 took the Anchor and
stood to sea Employed stowing
Anchors & Chains five Breezes
from S.W. Course N.E. all fair

Thursday April 7th

Commenced with fresh breezes
and fine weather from S.W. Course
N.E. & all fair Ends with
Cloudy from S.W. Course E.N.E.

Friday April 8th

Commenced with hazy and
veary to S.W. heading N.E. of the
wind Ends with fine weather to
S.W. veary to S.W.
