Wednesday April 20th 1870
Commenced with strong breezes
and squally rain from E. S. E.
with light E. S. E. wind from N. E.
around the spanker saw 4 sails

Commenced with strong
breezes from E. S. E. and a squall
and lost it - Ends with fine
weather from E. S. E. Sailed with
Genia

Friday April 22nd
Commenced with fine weather
from the Eastward Ends with fine
weather from N. E. Lat 31-39 S
Long 178-32 W

Saturday April 23rd
Commenced with light
breezes and fine weather from
N. E. at 4:30 saw Whales a long
way off stood further at dusk
got within 5 miles of them got the
byings and then came to the
sail and by the ship in the
leaving them in the morning
Ends with fine weather from N. E.
steering off E. S. E. and S. E.

Long 178-52 W
Sunday April 24th
Commenced with light - air and
squally from all parts Ends with dark
clouds from N. W. sailing to the
Westward
Lat 32-13 S
Long 178-20 W

Monday April 25th 1870
Commenced with fresh breezes
but dark cloudy from N. W. at
sunrise saw Whales working windward
lower 3 boats but a Bark struck
twice and sailed then no chance
for us to strike went out of sight
to windward

Tuesday April 26th
Commenced with light breezes
and a thick haze from the Westward
Ends with fresh breezes from N.
at Meridian French Rock in
sight off Deck bearing N. E. W.

Wednesday April 27th
Commenced with fine
breezes and haze from N. steering
off to the Eastward Ends with
fresh breezes and rain from E. S. E.
Lat 31-16 S
Long 178-32 W

Thursday April 28th
Commenced with strong
breezes and haze from the S. E.
saw 2 sails Ends with a fresh
breeze from the Eastward
Lat 31-36 S

Friday April 29th
Commenced with a fresh
breeze from the Eastward Ends with
strong breezes and thick squally
from N. E. Short sail opposite
Lacks
