Sunday June 19th 1870

All these 24 hours strong Trades
and frequent rain squalls Watch
on Liberty

Monday June 20th

Strong Trades, water on shore
on Liberty the other getting off Wood
and Water Coals. Arrived from
Stephen by Shore broke then Liberty
namely Billy Charley & Dick

Tuesday June 21st

All these 24 hours fine weather and
strong Trades took off one boat load of
Wood 3 Pigs 4 lbs of Sand

Wednesday June 22nd

All these 24 hours fine weather
took off one Boat Load of Wood 7 or 8 Pigs
took the 3 Disasters on Board again

Thursday June 23rd

All these 24 hours light baffling
airs and calms all ready for Sea
have shut

Friday June 24th

Commenced with light Trades
at 1 pm took off 24 inches Wood
out through the Keels at 7 pm
first Boats from E Course S.E. by
Ones with fresh Boats and fine
weather from E.S.E. Course S.E. by E

Saturday June 25th

Strong Boats and fine weather
from S.E. Course S.E. by E have a
back for a reef. Onas with thick and
rainy with light variable winds

Commenced with fresh Boats
and fine weather from S.W. by the
winds to the Southward. Onas with
strong Boats from S.W. by the wind
to S.E.

Lat 24.37 S

Wednesday June 29th

Commenced with strong Boats
and fine weather from S.W. heading
to S.E. Paunted S.E. Onas with
light baffling airs Paunted the S.E.

Thursday June 30th

Commenced with light baffling
airs from the S.E. to E heading to the
Southward of the wind. Onas heading

Friday July 1st 1870

Commenced with strong Boats
from the North Course E by N
Onas with light and baffling
winds from N.W. to W Course
E and E by S
