Saturday July 2nd 1870

Commenced with light and
breeze from the Western Quarter
heading to the East at 4 p.m. wind
batter to S.S.E. Made fine weather
at 7 Saw Whales a long way off
to windward at 9 wind shifted
up toward 3 Boats Enes chasing

Sunday July 3rd

Commenced with strong
breezes from E.S.E. Still chasing
et about 3.30 struck a Whale
Enes with fresh breezes and
hazy weather from E.S.E.

Monday July 4th

Commenced with fresh breezes
and fine weather from E.S.E.
Enes with strong breezes and squally
from N heading to the Eastward

Commenced with light breezes
and thick rain from the S
Enes with thick and rainy from

Commenced with thick rain
squally from W.S.W. Steady off
E.S.E. Short sail Enes with fine
weather from the South heading to
the East

Sunday July 10th

Commenced with fine weather
from the South heading to the East
Enes with light breezes and calm

Monday July 11th

Commenced with light breezes
and calm Enes with thick and
hazy from the S Enes local squally
from S.W. sail

Tuesday July 12th

Commenced with fresh breezes
and squally from the S heading
to the Westward. Short sail Enes
with hazy and calm. finished the
S.W. sail and set it
