

Remarks On Board Bark Northern Light Off
Wednesday July 13th 1870

Commenced with calm and
thick cloudy at 4 light breezes
and thick foggy from S.W.
Ones with light and baffling winds
with thick squally from all parts of
the compass

Thursday July 14th

Commenced with calm and
rainy at 4 p.m. took a breeze from
S.E. Steady W by S sheet sail being
thick and raining. Ones with fine
weather from S.E. heading S.W.
Employed repairing the Pepper main
top sail at Meridian. Passed to the
Windward of a Bark called the
Napoleon

Friday July 15th

Commenced with fine weather
from S.E. Ones with squally and
blustering weather from S.E. by the
wind to S.W.

Got 2357 S

Saturday July 16th

Commenced with strong breezes
and blustering weather from S.E.
repairing when by sail Ones the
same Capt Baker employed repairing
the Sparker

Sunday July 17th

Commenced with blustering
weather from S.E. heading to the S.W.
Ones with fine weather and light
breezes from the Eastward. Commenced S.W.
all day

Got 2455 S

New Bedford Capt Michael Baker Master

Monday July 18th 1870

Commenced with fine weather
and light breezes from the E. and
N.E. breeze S.W. Ones with
thick and cloudy from the E.
Employed putting salt water in the
iron hatch to trim ship

Tuesday July 19th

Commenced with strong
breezes shifted the lower main
top sail at 4 fresh S by E and
a rain storm from E heading
S.E. made strong sail and
raining

Got 2528 S

Wednesday July 20th

Commenced with thick and
rainy wind veering to the N.
and N.W. Ones with strong
breezes from N.W. heading to the
Westward sheet sail

Thursday July 21st

Commenced with strong
breezes from N.W. moderately
got top sail up and Sparker
heaved W by the wind Ones with
strong breezes and thick haze

Got 2606 S

July 179.00 W

Friday July 22nd

Commenced with strong
breezes and haze from W by N
sailed with the Milton. Eng with
strong breezes with very heavy
squalls with rain
