Thursday Aug 11th 1874

Commenced with a heavy
rain storm from E. S. E.
Ones with light breezes from
E. S. E. heading to the Westward
Employed fitting foot ropes
Lat 25.57 S
Long 178.40 E

Friday Aug 12th

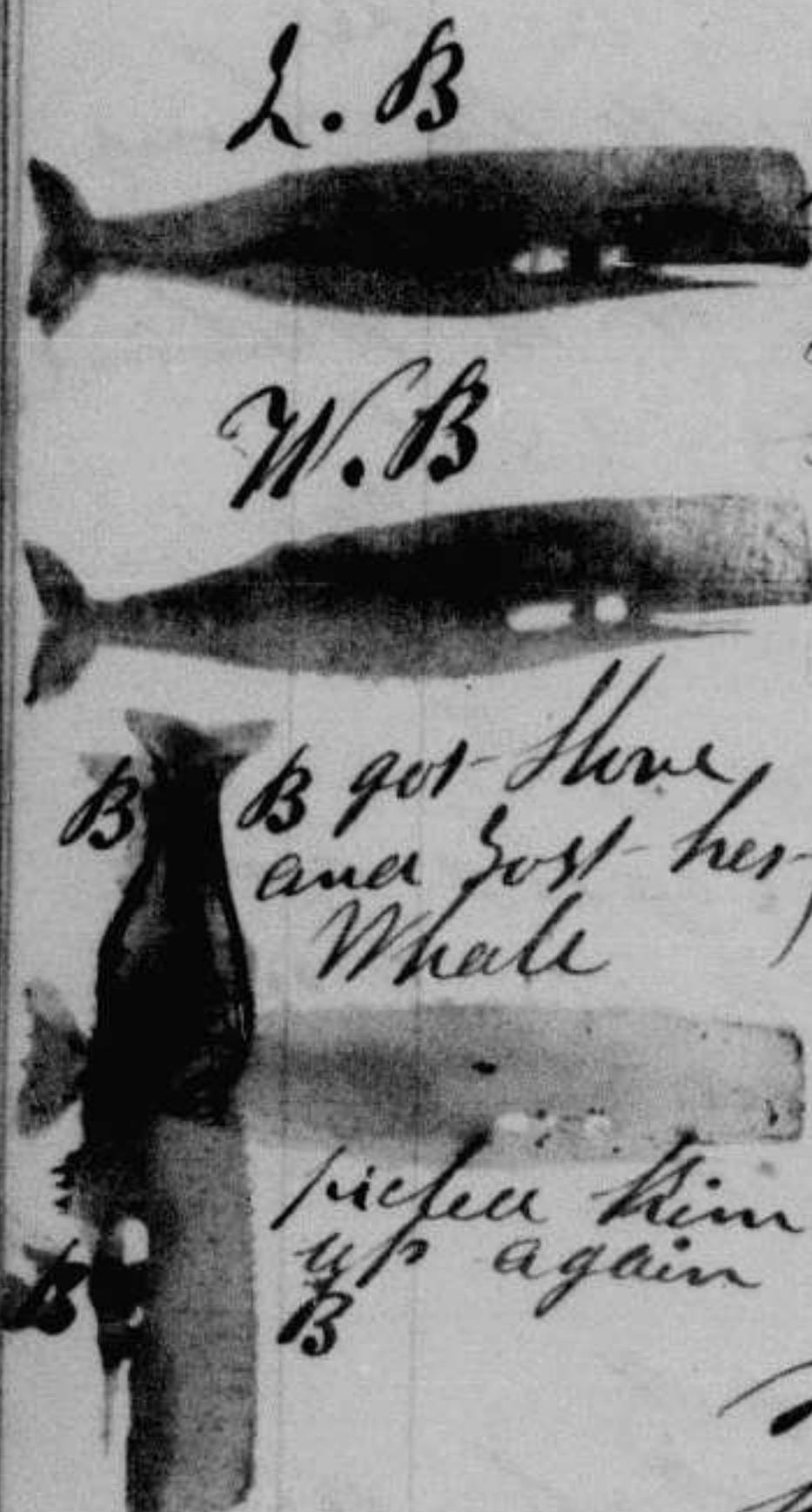
Commenced with fine weather
from E. S. E. at 3 1/2 m. Saw a
school of sperm whales lower
3 boats struck 3 B. B. got
stone lost the whale got the
whale alongside at 8 p.m.
Ones squally rain from
the Southward Employed a
cutting the whales

Saturday Aug 13th

Commenced with mixed
rainy from all parts with
heavy rain cleared away the
clouds got all ready to boil
at 4 p.m. heavy shower storm
middle moderate and cleared up
fine weather started the sperm whales
Ones the same all hands boiling
cutting up the blubber and
putting it in the tanks

Sunday Aug 14th

Commenced with light airs from
S. Employed boiling saw a dead
whale took and cut it belonging to
the B. B. ones with fine weather from the
Westward cleared away the clouds and
boiling

Monday Aug 15th

Commenced with light breezes
and fine weather from the Westward
Employed boiling ones with fine
weather finished boiling at 7 am

Tuesday Aug 16th

Commenced with fresh breezes
and fine weather from the Westward
and near by W. N. W. Employed at
clearing up coopersing &c &c ones
with fine weather from the Westward
Employed coopersing oil drawing
off flat lean oil
Lat 26.40 S
Long 174.26 E

Wednesday Aug 17th

Commenced with fine weather
at 4 p.m. began thick and
from S. W. started sail secured
the oil with extra lashings and
splicing there on deck middle
fresh sails and sailing ones fine
weather from N. W. heading to the
N. E. E. flowing down oil in the main
hatch

Thursday Aug 18th

Commenced with thick and
rainy from N. W. finished shoving
down to the ones with fine weather

Friday Aug 19th

Commenced with fine weather
from W. N. W. heading to the Southward
Ones with fine weather Employed
fitting footropes repairing the B. B. boat
with various jobs
