

Remarks On Board Bark *Forty Eight* Off
 Tuesday Sept 20th 1870
 Commences with thick and
 gusty weather from E. S. E. Course
 from N. to W. W. Ends fine
 pleasant weather Heavy N. W.
 breaking and falling Soft

Wednesday Sept 21st
 Commences with fine weather
 from S. E. Course N. Law 2
 Merchantmen finished plankers
 Soft and sent it aloft
 Ends with fine weather from the
 Eastward heading to the Northward
 Lat 25.30 S

Thursday Sept 22nd
 Commences with fine weather
 from E. heading to the Northward at
 sunset heading to the Southward
 Ends with fine weather at 6 am
 saw 3 sperm Whales lower 3 Boats
 about 9 struck in the N. B. got
 stove and the 1st boat drove
 Struck in the S. B. and E. B.
 Lat 25.14 S

Friday Sept 23rd
 Commences with fine weather
 from E. S. E. got the Whale to the
 ship and cut one of them
 Saw thick and hazy from S. E.
 Cut the other Whale saw a large
 one Whale lower 3 Boats and
 struck for Heaven got stove

New Bedford Capt Michael Baker Master
 Saturday Sept 24th 1870
 Commences with thick and
 rainy till fast to the Whale run
 to alindward and turned him up
 about 3 got him alongside at
 midnight Ends with a fresh
 Gale and raining from S. E.
 cleared away the Heads riced a
 rain Sails and started the
 works boiling the Heads

Sunday Sept 25th
 Commences with fresh Sails
 and a heavy rain storm from
 S. E. put an extra Hopper on
 the Whale and scuffed him employed
 boiling muller a heavy Gale
 had to wear the Whale off at
 7 hauled him along to wear
 ship for cutting faster the Whale
 than wear him off Ends with
 a rain storm

Monday Sept 26th
 Commences with a strong Gale
 from S. E. and a sudden shift
 to S. W. took the Hoppers on the
 Port side Ends with fine weather
 and riced with the Whale along
 side Commenced cutting

Tuesday Sept 27th
 Commences with strong breezes
 and fine weather got the Sails and
 punk started the Works Ends with
 fine weather employed boiling and
 Baling the Case
