 Monday Jan 23<sup>rd</sup> 1871  
 Commenced with strong  
 breezes from E. Coarse W. by S  
 ends with strong breezes from  
 E and E.N.E. heading to the N  
 Employed repairing M.S. S. Sail.

Tuesday Jan 24<sup>th</sup>  
 Commenced with strong  
 breezes from E.N.E. at 2 p.m.  
 Kept off N.W. by W. ends with  
 a fresh Gale from E.N.E. at  
 daylight kept off N.W. by W.  
 Luffed to at 11.30  
 Lat 29.45 S

Wednesday Jan 25<sup>th</sup>  
 Commenced with a fresh  
 Gale from E.N.E. at 3 p.m. Kept  
 off N.W. by W. again run till  
 sunset. Middle and latter  
 strong breezes from E.N.E. at  
 daylight kept off N.W. by W. and  
 N.W. at 11 saw Norfolk  
 Island bearing N.W. by W.  
 Lat 29.20 S

Thursday Jan 26<sup>th</sup>  
 Commenced with strong  
 breezes from E.N.E. at 4 p.m.  
 Landed Capt Baker and  
 James. Steved off to the boat  
 ends with strong breezes from  
 the E hanging out E of the land

New Bedford Capt Michael Baker Master  
 Friday Jan 27<sup>th</sup> 1871  
 Strong breezes from E by N  
 hanging on to windward Middle  
 and latter the same  
 Lat 28.49 S  
 Long 169.07.30 E

Saturday Jan 28<sup>th</sup>  
 Strong breezes from E by N  
 Oposit looks to the N and  
 S of the Island Employed cutting  
 of the knots and planing off  
 the Decks ends the same took  
 off 2 Boat loads Potatoes Onions  
 2 Cold Boats

Sunday Jan 29<sup>th</sup>  
 Commenced with strong breezes  
 from the East at 2 p.m. Capt  
 Baker and James. Same off  
 Steved to the Southward  
 ends with fine weather  
 Lat 29.53 S

Monday Jan 30<sup>th</sup>  
 Commenced with fine weather  
 and light breezes from the E  
 heading to the South at 4 p.m.  
 saw Whale took me got him  
 to the ship at dusk ends with  
 light airs but the Whale was  
 cleared away the Head started the  
 tryworks
