 Sunday Feb 19th 1871
 Commences with squally
 from E. & S. heading to the S.E.
 under easy sail. Middle thick
 and squally from all parts of
 the compass off and to the S.E.
 of the Island

Monday Feb 20th
 Commences with light and
 baffling winds with cloudy
 weather. Middle and latter thick
 and rainy. Flood in port and

Tuesday Feb 21st
 Commences squally sent in
 2 boats took off a spare
 spar. Middle calm. Ends with
 thick foggy from E. & N. off and
 on. Can't get in to land a
 boat after the Captain

Wednesday Feb 22nd
 Commences with light
 and calm. Ends the same

Thursday Feb 23rd
 Thick foggy at 1.30 P.M. sent
 a boat for Capt Baker & family
 Come off at 4 P.M. Stove to S.E.
 Ends with a heavy rain storm

Friday Feb 24th
 Commences heavy rain storm
 from E. & N. off and to the
 ends with cloudy weather from
 the Northward. Heavy S.
 Lat 29.44 S

New Bedford Capt Michael Baker Master
 Saturday Feb 25th 1871
 Commences with light breezes
 from N.W. & S.E. & S. & S.W.
 Scraping mast for and aft
 and making a new top mast
 of the spar got from there
 Goes with fine weather from
 N.W. & S.W. on the top mast
 with various jobs of ship duties
 Lat 30.14 S
 Long 171.08 E

Sunday Feb 26th
 Commences with fine weather
 from N.W. & S.W. & S. & S.E. all
 sail beat a new top sail
 Middle and latter squally and
 rainy
 Lat 31.21 S

Monday Feb 27th
 Commences with thick and
 raining from N.W. & S.W. & S.
 & S.E. all sail. Ends with fresh
 breezes from from the Westward
 and squally from S.E.
 Lat 33.01 S
 Long 173.34 E

Tuesday Feb 28th
 Commences with strong breezes
 and squally from the Westward
 at 4 P.M. a strong gale from S.W.
 heading to the S. & S.E. ends with fresh
 gales and squally from S.W. to
 N and back to S.W.
