

Remarks On Board Northern Light Of New

Saturday June 10th 1871
Commences with strong breezes
and rough squally from E.W. Course
N.E. by E heavy head but sea smooth
Set sails and with strong breezes
and rough from S.W.

Long 35° 00' W

Sunday June 11th
Commences with a fresh Gale
from E.W. lower Set sails and courses
Course N.E. by E and Middle light
breezes from S.E. and with light
and all calm Course N.E. by E

Lat 27° 08' S
Long 33° 45' W

Monday June 12th
Commences with fine weather
and fresh breezes from S.E. Course
N.E. by E and light and all
bearing from S.E. to E. Employed
hatterly down Set Mast Rigger
and dressing out the Star Set Sail
Base

Lat 29° 50' S
Long 33° 15' W

Tuesday June 13th
Commences light and all calm
Employed ratterly down Set Mast
and Mizen Riggers and with
light and from E.W. and E
by the wind to the S.E. all sail
Employed on the Rigger in different
parts of the ship

Lat 29° 03' S
Long 32° 23' W

Wednesday June 14th 1871
Commences with light breezes
from N.W. Course E.S. by E and
tail the Watcher Employed on the
Rigger and with strong breezes from
N.W. to N. by the wind to the Eastward
Spoke a Spence's Bark Lat 27° 50' S
found Chas & Co. Lat 32° 57' W

Thursday June 15th
Strong breezes from E. heading E.W.
Employed on the Rigger in different
parts of the ship Middle and all
strong breezes and squally E.W.
N.E. by the wind all sail to the
E.S.

Lat 26° 49' S
Long 30° 06' W

Friday June 16th
Strong breezes and some squalls
from E.W. heading N.E. by the wind
2 sails in light and with light
breezes from N.W. and N.E. by the
wind to S.E. all sail the Watcher
Employed on the Rigger

Lat 25° 36' S
Long 29° 03' W

Saturday June 17th
Commences calm 2 sails in light
and light breezes from E.S. by the
wind to the N. and with fine
weather and fresh breezes from E.S.
heading N.E. by the wind all sail the Watcher
Employed on the Rigger

Long 29° 46' W
