

J & C — 1845

Friday the 19th

This day light winds from the S & E steering S S W employed in ships duty sail in sight speak a merchant barque bound for Montevideo, 10 miles 30 miles

Saturday the 20th

Light winds steering S S W employed in ships duty sail in sight our S S W this morning sail in sight 30 miles 40

Sunday the 21st

Light winds from the S & E steering S S W 24 hours S S W no work going in Lat 14° 57' South nothing in sight these 24 hours 30

Monday the 22nd

Light winds from the S & E steering S S W employed in ships duty sail in sight which proved by her signal to be a Portuguese government brig steering about West 30 miles

Tuesday the 23rd

Pleasant day light winds from the S & E steering S S W with fore topmast and main top gallant stee sails out both sides & sail in sight 30 miles these 24 hours

December

Wednesday the 24th

Beautiful day fine breeze from the S & E steering S S W employed in ships duty sail in sight of a jumbo 30 miles 30

Thursday the 25th

Commences with a fine fair wind from the S & E steering S S W employed in ships duty sail in sight in sight and last part strong winds with men shortened sail to double reefed topsails and fore sail the wind hauled out ahead so goes these 24 hours 30

Christmas Day 1845

Friday the 26th

This day fine breeze steering on the wind employed in ships duty nothing in sight these 24 hours

Saturday the 27th

Fine gentle breeze from the N N E steering S S W employed in ships duty 30 miles these 24 hours

Sunday the 28th

Fair weather fine breeze going off at the rate of 8 or 10 knots per hour S S W with the wind from the N N E nothing but ship jacks in sight carrying 3 S. Hooks 30 miles these 24 hours
