windward of us with sails
out fore and aft I guess that
she does not like cold weather
and is in a hurry to get out
of it

But the 31st light winds from the
South I sail in sight saw
some Porpoises and we saw
a plenty of fin backs also
our course is about W S W
it ends the last day of the week and
the last day of January 1848

Sun the 1st This being the first day
of the month first part steady
breeze from the S S E some foggy
I sail in sight saw a plenty
of fin backs and Porpoises our
course W by S last part very light
winds from the South

Mon the 2nd moderate breeze from the
S W steady on the wind cold
and foggy I sail in sight 1 of
them was steering to the East
ward no sail but that she is
down wind the Cape success
to her we struck a Porpoise and
hauled him up to the Gibe
barn 900 and the Tom came
out and we lost that fish
saw some fin backs but no
want others fish

Tues the 3rd This day light head winds
I sail in sight saw a plenty
of Whight whale porpoises and
we also saw some Grampuses
the weather tolerable fair but
rather cold brook out the after
hatch for flour so was

Thurs the 4th This day fresh breeze from
the S E steady S W by S
I sail in sight employed in
flying new main royal
rigging and stowing up S
spart boat struck a Porpoise and
lost him for amusement
