 what are lower & boats and
 the starboard boat
 struck  her line
 he took  her line
 and parted the starboard boat
 line then the S B picked up
 her line again and and the S B
 bent on then the N B went up
 and struck so we got her, and
 took him along side about 7
 o'clock P.M. and went to work
 and rove our falls so inches. 24

 4 AM and finished him about 1
 o'clock P.M. and were ship and put
 her under close reefed main top
 sail and fore sail and stood
 N W By N with the wind about
 N W nothing in sight this
 day

Feb. the 7th Strong winds from the
 N W steering N W By N
 mizen in boiling water and
 watch a sail in sight last part
 fished the fore and mizen
 top sail but still kept the ship
 of her course so goes the times

Sunday the 5th This 24 hours begin with a strong breeze from
 the S steering N W. 1 o'clock saw a sail steering to the westward
 strong breeze through the night at 4 o'clock spoke the barque
 Flora of New London 9 months out 2200 bound home boiling.

Monday the 9th This 24 hours begin with a strong breeze from the S.
 steering N E. 4 P.M. rose three wright whales, lowered
 without success. Strong breeze through the night. Cold
 down the first part of the night. 

Tuesday the 10th. This 24 hours begin with fine weather and in
 by whales in sight. lowered but without success. Per set
 took in sail. Latter part plenty of whale in sight lowered
 without success blowing strong 10 o'clock stowing down
 the oil.

Wednesday the 11th. The first part of this 24 hours all hands
 employed in stowing down at 4 P.M. got done. Latter
 strong breeze from the S W. plenty whale in sight
 at 8 o'clock got fast and drew

Thursday the 12th. The first part of this 24 hours strong
 wind from the S W. plenty whales in sight and the
 water took in sail. Latter part lowered without
 success

Friday the 13th. The first part of this 24 hours light breeze
 some whales in sight struck one, turn him up, took
 the ship. All calling in strong breeze from S W.

Saturday the 14th. The first part of this 24 hours some with
 fog put 2 reefs in the top sail at 2 o'clock. blowing
 Latter part fine weather employed in spearing but saw
 nothing.
