

June 1846

When the 29<sup>th</sup> this day good breeze & sail  
in sight saw a plenty of  
fin backs and several right  
whales but could not catch  
one this time employed in  
boiling fitting boats draft  
96 brook out the fore hole

When the 30<sup>th</sup> calm employed in  
boiling & sail in sight  
saw a plenty of whales  
but could not catch them  
& ships got whales in sight  
of us good luck to them  
last part light breeze

July 1846

When the 1<sup>st</sup> strong breeze Decible  
sea main top sail and fore  
top mast stay sail employed in  
boiling & sail in sight heavy  
sea in evening these 24 hours

Thursday the 2<sup>nd</sup> this day light breeze  
and foggy with a considerable  
sea on cooler even employed  
in sailing saw a plenty of right  
whales however once but did not  
get them the reminder of the  
day the weather was too thick to  
lower a sail in sight spoke ship  
Gloria of New Bedford and the  
barge Concordia of Say harbour  
so ended the 2<sup>nd</sup> of July 1846

Friday the 3<sup>rd</sup> strong breeze and foggy  
with a considerable sea on employed  
in sailing lower part of the fore  
and main hatchway two sail  
in sight but no whales

Sat the 4<sup>th</sup> strong breeze rough and  
foggy no whales in sight  
sail spoke the barge  
Concordia of Say harbour lying  
to under close reef main top  
sail and fore sail top mast stay  
sail so ended the 4<sup>th</sup> of July 1846
