

October 1844

Mon the 26th strong breeze blowing
of and on at Mangier the S.
Boat went in shore but retur-
ned on board again at 3 P.M.
with a few eggs and we start-
ed for White or some where
else, so goes the times.

Tues the 27th a strong breeze from
the S.E. steering close hauled
on the Starboard tack.

Thurs the 28th strong breeze from
the S.E. double reef top sails
standing on the S tack
saw nothing through the
day.

Fri the 29th strong breeze from
the S.E. steering to the
South under double reef
top sails so goes saw nothing.

Sat the 30th strong breeze from
the S.E. steering to the
South saw nothing
double reef top sails

Sat the 31st light breeze from
the S.E. steering to the
South with whole top
sails and top gullion
sails and jib, gill saw
nothing through the day.

Nov 1846

Sunday Nov the 1st 1846 light breeze
from the S.E. steering to
the South saw nothing
through the day Lat 25.48 north

Mon the 2nd light breeze from the S.E.
with all sail set steering
to the S.E. saw nothing
so ends these 4 and 20 hours.

Tues the 3rd these 24 hours good breeze
from the Westward steering
S.E. we caught a Porpoise
this morning. so goes the days

Thurs the 4th continues the same but
saw nothing. times runs well
but live in hopes if we fly
in Dispair - - - - -

Fri the 5th fine breeze with squally
by spells saw a plenty of
Porpoises around saw one
fine back view at 4 P.M.
tacked ship and steered to the
South so goes these 24 hours

Sat the 6th first part strong breeze
at 7 P.M. double reef the
top sails hauling south at 11
P.M. close reef the top sails and
furled the main sail and gill
so goes the times like one day
