Frid the 20th at 6. He turned the ruffs out of the top sail and set the main top gallant sail last part moderate breeze from the W. steering E. By N. with all sail set & goes.

Sat the 21st a steady breeze from the West with all sail out steering to the East saw nothing employed in fitting loose straps so ends these 24 hours.

Sun the 22nd good breeze with light squalls from the West steering to the East By North saw nothing these 24 hours.

Mon the 23rd strong breeze from the West with good weather steering East By North employed in mending the calross cover nothing in sight these 24 hours last part light squalls & goes.

Tues the 24th strong breeze from the West steering East By N. saw nothing these 24 hours some squally but light so goes the happy times.

Wed the 25th this day a strong breeze from the S.W. steering E. By N. saw nothing.

Thurs the 26th a strong S.W. breeze steering E. By N. saw nothing these 24 hours.

Frid the 27th a strong breeze from the W. S.W. steering E. By N. thick foggy saw nothing this day.

Sat the 28th a steady moderate breeze from the W. steering E. By N. some foggy saw nothing.

Sunday the 29th light breeze from the W. S.W. steering E. By N. thick mist part of the day saw some fine ducks last part saw a Brig to the leeward at 4 left to the wire and took in sail & goes.

Mon the 30th light breeze from the West at 4. He saw a school of black fish and a sail at 6 He saw Wright Whales lowered 4 boats and

Lat 43.49 gave chase but without success at 11 He saw another gang to windward quick & sail in sight at 6 P.M. lowered 3 boats without success so goes.
