

December 1846

Thurs the 9th the first part fine breeze from the W at 1 saw a right whale lowered and got fast at 4 passed 5 at 6 commenced to cut him in at 11 got him in last part strong breeze from the WNW saw two right whales & sail in sight



Fri the 10th the first part fine weather middle part the same employed in boiling and chasing whales whales plenty and with the last part good weather struck a right whale to the S.B. and got him to spouting blood but the line got cut and we lost him

Sat the 11th the first part good weather employed in stowing down and chasing whales from ship. Carrivan of Fall River sh hailed nothing Lat 45.40 south



Sat the 12th the first part fine weather employed in chasing whales 12 sail in sight lowered without success



Sunday the 13th the first part light breeze from the S.W. all hands employed in stowing down middle good weather last part light breeze from the South Lat 45.21 S

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Mon the 14th the first part fine breeze from the S.E. saw a right whale lowered and got him at 5 began to cut at 10 got him in and started the fire last part fine weather plenty of ships in sight



Tues the 15th the first part light winds from the South lowered whale without success steering to the East on the wind & sail in sight Lat 45.25 south



Wed the 16th the first part fine weather light breeze from the S.W. steering to the west employed in stowing down plenty of ships in sight



Thurs the 17th the first part employed in stowing down at 4 spoke the Tobias of New Bedford and the Isaac Howland of N Bedford lowered for whales without success



Friday the 18th the first part light wind from the WNW at 9 spoke the ship Rose of New Bedford saw a dead whale 3 miles to the windward of us at 2 look him along side

Sat the 19th cut him in and started the new light breeze from the south
