

December 1846

Sunday the 20th the first part fine breeze from the south at 1 lowered for whales got fast killed and stuck him last part employed in towing and chasing whales

Mon the 21st the first part strong breeze from the WSW last part wind south employed in stowing down in the fore peak

Tues the 22nd the first part strong breeze from the south employed in stowing down and chasing whales without success Lat 42° 03' S



Wednes the 23^d the first part strong breeze from the WSW employed in stowing down and chasing wild whales without success 2 sail in sight



Thurs the 24th the first part strong breeze from the WSW lowered for whales and got one and stuck him to the ship 3 sail in sight

Frid the 25th the first part employed in cutting at 11 cut him in at 3 lowered without success last part gamed with the Isaac Howland Lat 47° 45' south



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Sat the 26th the first part strong breeze from the WSW employed in towing last part blowing very hard so that had to cool down and leave the ship to under a close reef main top sail 2 sail in sight

Sun the 27th the first part heavy gale from the WSW last part the wind more moderate

Mon the 28th the first part strong breeze from the WSW heading Nth at 11 set close reef fore and main top sails and stowed the works again last part finished towing 3 sail in sight

Tues the 29th the first part strong breeze from the WSW with rain stowing in the wind to the SW last part gale took in sail and have to

Wednes the 30th the first part strong wind from the WSW under double reef top sails spoke the Isaac Howland 2 sail in sight

Thurs the 31st the first part fine breeze from the W at 6 spoke the Isaac game with her Lat 47° 15' south
