Monday March the 1st a fine breeze from the S.E. steering N.W. By W. commenced taking down the rigging

Tues the 2nd fine weather and a good breeze from the S.E. steering N.W. By W. employed in taking down saw nothing this day

Weds the 3rd good weather fine breeze from the S.E. steering N.W. employed in taking rigging saw nothing Lat 19.00. South.

Thurs the 4th strong breeze from the S.E. steering N.W. saw a whale of some kind spout we lay to about 2 hours but saw him no more
Lat 17.16. South

Frid the 5th a strong breeze from the S.E. steering N.W. By W. with all sail saw nothing

Sat the 6th a strong breeze steering N.W. By W. some squally saw nothing Lat 19.20. S

Sunday the 7th light breeze steering N.W. By W. saw nothing
Lat 17.45. South

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Mon the 8th a strong breeze from the S.E. steering N.W. By W. saw nothing through the day

Tues the 9th a strong breeze steering N.W. By W. saw nothing this day

Weds the 10th a strong breeze steering N.W. saw nothing this day

Thurs the 11th a good breeze steering N.W. saw some fin backs.

Frid the 12th a strong breeze steering N.W. By W. employed in ratting down saw some fin backs and caught 20 Porpoises so ended these 24 hours.

Sat the 13th a good breeze steering N.W. By W. employed in ratting down at 4 P.M. saw S. Whales lowered but caught nothing

Sunday the 14th saw S. Whales again this morning lowered the Capt struck one which ran him out of town he had to cut and let him go so goes

Mon the 15th saw Whales again at 10.30 lowered and got one to the W. Boat took him to the ship and began to cut but we had to lash down and give up for Right Lat 17.20. South.
