

Journal of G. K. Bartlett
of his passage from
New Bedford to Fayal
in Bark Ocean Capt. East
& return in the Ayer Capt. Lake
Tuesday July 21st 1874.

At quarter past ten
we left the wharf
for the Bark in
the tug boat which
towed until one
o'clock. then she
left us with all
on board except
the boys which
left at midnight.
(2nd) we then were
headed for sea.

Wed. July 22nd 1874
Commenced with a
strong N. E. breeze
ship under topsails
I began to get very
seasick.

We began to-day to
send men to the
masthead on lookout
and fix the boats
ready for whaling
also began to make
Scolthmen and chaffing
gear for the rigging
which is a hard
job where there is
no carpenter.
