

Sunday Aug 16th 1874.

Lat 38° 45' N. Long. 39° 58' W

Commences with a light breeze from the S.E. At daylight there were several sails in sight some very near the ship. In the afternoon the wind increased to a good breeze.

At 4 o'clock p.m. they sung out from aloft "A. Glau" but they did not see it again.

Ship going before the wind all day at 10 p.m. we hauled her up on the wind.

Mon. Aug 17th 1874.

Lat 40° 0' N. Long. 39° 34' W

Commences with a good strong breeze from the S.W. all hands engaged in breaking out for water. This morning our cooper begins to work again after a sickness of three weeks.

About 2 o'clock a whaler hove in sight we steered for him and at 4 o'clock he hauled up his main-sail thus inviting us to gain it was the Stamboul and
