

Thurs. Sept 3rd 1874.
Lat. 39.36. Long. 31.43 W.
Commences with a
stiff breeze from S.E.
and continues so
through the morning
at 11 am. we sight
Flores & Larvo right
ahead. We had this
breeze all day.

At 7 p.m., we tacked
ship and stood
to eastward. Tacked
again at midnight
and stood in for
land again. So
as to be in pretty
handy at daylight.

Fri. Sept 4th 1874.
Lat. 39.28 N. Long. 30.24 W.
Commences with a
light breeze from the
S. Flores & Larvo are
this morning, both
in sight. This breeze
continues through
the day. At about
7 o'clock in the evening
we saw two schools
of Blackfish spouting
very near the ship
there were some very
large ones in the
school which would
have made two or three
barrels of oil.
