

Mon. Sept. 14th 1874.
Fayal Island.
Commences with light
S.W. winds and
continues so through
the day. At about
9 o'clock this morning
the Ocean, hove in
sight. I was with
Capt. Pease all day,
he went off again
at night as he
did not want to
leave his ship all
night. The Pacific
beat through the
passage about
dark tonight.

Tues. Sept 15th 1874.
Fayal Island
Commences with
light winds from
S.W. Saw Capt. Pease
this morning. At 10 o'clock
we started on donkeys
for the crater about
8 miles we arrived
there at 10 o'clock and
Capt. Woodbury & I went
down 1700 ft into it
we got up at the
top of it about 5 o'clock
and then started
for home we arrived
at home at about 7
o'clock & we pretty tired
