so that we cannot
head our course
and continues so
through the day un-
til toward night
when it gradually
dies away to a
calm and continues
so through the most
of the night. We
now think the wind
is coming out in
another gale and hope
it will be S.W. or S.

Fri. Oct 30th 18⁷⁴.
Lat. 37.00 Lon. 66.33
Commences with a
light breeze from the
S.W. just where we
want it & it is gradually
increasing up to 12 O'
clock we are making $7\frac{1}{2}$ knots.
We entered the Sub-
stream about 3 O'clock
the edge of it was
very perceptible toward
night the wind
increased and blew
very hard up to
12 O'clock at night we
were going 9 knots then
it rained & killed the wind.
