

Wed Nov. 4<sup>th</sup> 1894.  
Lat 40.17 Long. 69.08  
Commences with a  
nice breeze from the  
S. E. At about 10 A.M.  
we passed a large  
Steamship for Europe. We  
think we are pretty  
near home if our  
observation are right.  
Frank Dabney & I stayed  
to the masthead from 8  
till 8 1/2 pm looking for  
the S. S. lightship. Then  
Seyd D & I stayed up  
there from 9 1/2 till 10  
but we did not see it  
& it was not seen at all  
as we were too far away.

Thurs Nov. 5<sup>th</sup> 1894.  
Lat. 41.30 Long. 70.26 W  
Commences with a  
SW wind and is  
breezing up all the  
time. At 9 o'clock we  
raised land as we  
approached it it proved  
to be Roman's land.  
Then we got abreast  
of it we took a  
Pilot, the wind is  
still increasing and  
as we get in further  
the land looks very  
natural as we go  
by Clarks Point  
it looks like home
