

Remarks Pass on Board Bk. Ocean New Bedford
 July 1879
 67 Monday 28th Com. with light sails & the S.W. to
 Cates and N. S. W. the ship on opposite tack with fog and
 rain saw some vessel at 2 P.M. which boiled fat
 can and cleared up the decks and washed off all
 ready for a mother. Whale Midace part fresh voice
 from N. S. W. the ship on the northern tack. Latter part
 light rain from S.W. to N.W. at 6 P.M. commenced to
 storm down the main hatch saw the Bk. Atlantic and
 a number of Merchant Vessels Lat 50° 13' N
 Long 22° 30' W
 68 Tuesday 29th Com. with light sails and a calm and a
 heavy swell from the N.W. at 4 P.M. finish stowing
 a few saw some steamer coming N. Minnie part
 light air from N. the ship on the S. and Western tack
 at 8 P.M. began a Italian ship and set letters to
 the back. Latter part light voice from the North and
 pleasant. Look the ship boiling. Lat 50° 08' N
 Long 22° 16' W
 69 Wednesday 30th Com. with light sails from N. and
 give weather steering rightward crossed the Bk.
 Atlantic in sight. Middle part light air and calm at
 5 P.M. the cap of the Bk. Atlantic came on board and report
 2 Whales 2 Whales 12 M. S. Oil. Latter part fresh breeze from S.E.
 and rain the ship on the Southern tack the watch employ
 in washing ship the Atlantic in sight Lat 49° 53' N
 Long 22° 17' W
 70 Thursday 31st Com. with light sails from S.E. the
 ship on the Southern tack. Fluctuating the Atlantic
 Bk. in sight. Middle part fresh voice from N.E. Latter part
 the wind the same steering N.W. by W. at 8 A.M. raised the
 one point on the S. bow at 9 A.M. four boats the London
 Boat got 2 plank above us by a bomb gun at 10 A.M. the S.
 Boat crew rolled her in going out to strike a Whale the boat
 Boat picked her up and took her to the ship the Boat
 struck at turning her Whale up and got a small hole there
 is about a fastening to the Whale so ends the ship.
 no working to the main brace to take the Whale

While Cruising in North Atlantic Ocean after Spinn Oil
 Aug 1879
 71 Friday 1st Com. with strong voice from N.E. at 1 P.M.
 look the Whale along side at 4 P.M. commenced to eat
 Boat took at 9 P.M. cut the board in and left the Whale over board
 the Whale got supper and set the watch. Middle part calm
 Latter part the same at 6 P.M. raised the Whales again but
 did not lower for them waiting for a breeze set sight of
 them at 10 P.M. at 10 P.M. had the case over board and
 got dinner calm Lat 49° 02' N
 Long 22° 44' W
 72 Saturday 2nd Com. with light air and a calm
 from all points of the compass at 2 P.M. raised the
 Whales at 4 P.M. part 5 P.M. got supper and set the
 watch saw a number of Merchant Vessels. Middle
 part light air and a calm and a pleasant weather. Latter
 part light breeze from the S.W. by compass the ship on opposite
 tack under all sail any quantity of Brampusses in
 sight and the back saw a large number of Merchant Vessels
 and steamers the watch employed in boiling Lat 48° 47' N
 Long 23° 09' W
 73 Sunday 3rd Com. with light sails from N. and
 the kind of weather steering N.W. and N. by compass
 plenty of the back in sight and every thing but Spinn
 Whales. Middle part fresh breeze from S.E. and rain
 the ship under easy sail boiling at 10 P.M. a
 Merchant 15 ft long in sail and fire above close to
 us thinking that we were on fire but found her
 mistake in getting close to us. Latter part fresh
 voice still and passing rain squalls at 6 P.M.
 finish boiling at 8 A.M. steering S.E. by E. Lat 49° 18' N
 Long 22° 50' W
 74 Monday 4th Com. with fresh breeze from N.
 the ship under a easy sail on the Northern tack saw
 a number of Merchant Vessels bound E. and West
 and some steamers. Middle part fresh voice from N.
 at 11 the ship on opposite tack. Latter part fresh voice
 from N. to S.W. a few passing rain squalls all hands
 employed in stowing cargo. Oil in the main hatch
 saw quite a number of Merchant Vessels
 Lat 49° 28' N
 Long 22° 46' W
