

Remarks: Pass On Board Bk. Ocean - New Bedford 1879

July 4th Tuesday 5th Com. with fresh breezes from N.W. the ship out the Tana Western tack a fur passing rain squalls and a heavy swell from N.W. at 2 P.M. which slowing down 7/8 and masted of ship all ready for a further whale. Midale part light wind from N.W. the ship on different tack saw a plenty of Grampuses latter part light airs the watch employed in various jobs saw a plenty of Grampuses Lat 48° 45' N. Long 23° 08' W

July 6th Wednesday 6th Com. with light airs from the N.W. repairing splenda weather steering by compass at 8 P.M. saw a number of Merchant vessels and some Steamer boats. Midale part light wind from N.W. and rain. Thick weather latter part fresh gales from N.W. to N.W. the Bk. on different tack saw and foggy the Bk. under easy sail the watch employed in various jobs

July 7th Thursday 7th Com. with light gales from N.W. rain and foggy the ship on the North and Eastern tack under easy sail Midale part moderate rain latter part light rain from the N.W. to N.W. and a heavy swell from N.W. the ship on different tack the watch employed in repairing the main sail. Nothing in sight Lat 49° 21' N. Long 22° 38' W

July 8th Friday 8th Com. with light airs from N.W. the ship on the Northern tack a heavy swell from the N.W. nothing in sight but the backs of the watch employed in repairing main sail at 5 P.M. but the main sail in a heavy storm Midale and latter part fresh breeze from N.W. to N.W. rain and foggy the most of the time saw a Steamer ship bound E. Lat 49° 35' N. Long 22° 50' W

July 9th Saturday 9th Com. with thick weather midale N.W. at 1 P.M. the fog lifted and saw some sail steering N.W. and a fur Merchant vessels and a plenty of Grampuses. Midale part thick fog and rain, rain and N.W. the ship under easy sail on different tack latter part strong breeze from N.W. and rain and foggy heavy unpleasant fog and rain. Sick weather would sweet home shall never see my home again

While Cruising in North Atlantic Ocean after Spinnaker

July 10th Sunday 10th Com. with light gales from N.W. thick fog the ship under easy sail on the North and Western tack Midale part fresh gales from the South at 1 P.M. more ship to the East gave clear weather latter part fresh breezes from N.W. the ship on the Northern tack foggy and rain saw one Steamer bound N.W. and to Merchant vessels bound N.W. all sail Lat 49° 58' N. Long 22° 37' W

July 11th Monday 11th Com. with light rain from N.W. thick midale cloudy weather and some foggy the ship on the North and Eastern tack at 1 P.M. made some sail saw one Steamer bound N.W. at sun down took in sail more ship to the N.W. by compass Midale and latter part fresh gales from the N.W. with squalls of rain Lat 49° 19' N. Long 22° 17' W

July 12th Tuesday 12th Com. with fresh gales from N.W. and rain squalls the ship on the South and Western tack to Merchant vessels pass close to us bound N.W. Midale and latter part light gales from N.W. to N.W. and rain squalls Lat 49° 16' N. Long 23° 12' W

July 13th Wednesday 13th Com. with fresh gales from N.W. with rain squalls the Bk. under close reefed main top sail Main Spiller Midale part moderate rain latter part fresh breezes from N.W. at 8 P.M. more ship to the South and Western tack on the Tana Western tack and a number of Merchant vessels Lat 49° 34' N. Long 23° 37' W

July 14th Thursday 14th Com. with light rain from N.W. and a heavy swell thick overcast saw a number of Merchant vessels and some Whale Bk. at 3 P.M. caught a Porpoise Midale part light gales from N.W. steering N.W. by N. plenty of rain latter part light gales from N.W. and N.W. the ship on the Southern and Western tack saw one Merchant vessel in sight some rain squalls and a heavy swell from the N.W. the ship under double top sails and a fur and fore sail and Boat Steerer sick of duty by the name of Milson kept him self by falling on his back Lat 49° 15' N. Long 23° 56' W
