

Remarks. Tues. On Board Bk. Ocean of New Bedford 1879

Aug 21st ⁹¹ Wednesday 21st Com. with light Gale from N. N. W. the ship drifting to the Eastward with the Whale Head at 2 P. M. finish stowing down 400 Oil Mice and latter part fresh Gale from N. N. W. to N. W. fresh squalls of rain and wind a very high sea running the ship still drifting to the Eastward with the Whale Head no other rain squalls for 24 hours weather - but little hopes of seeing much now sail but for Merchant Vessels Lat 49° 17' N Long 20° 53' W

⁹² Thursday 22nd Com. with fresh Gale from N. W. and a heavy sea the ship still drifting with the Whale Head to the Eastward Midday part morning latter part light air and calm at 4 P. M. called all hands and hooked on the Whale Head at 11 A. M. finish Baling the case along side of the ship and all hands got Black Jack Lat 49° 06' N Long 20° 30' W

⁹³ Friday 23rd Com. with light air from the South at 3 P. M. the Bk. entered the Gulf of St. Johns spoke up at half past 3 P. M. finish cutting the head fresh mounds from S. and rain steering N. W. by compass at 6th at supper and set the watch Midday part fresh wind S. E. and rain steering N. W. latter part light wind S. and S. E. fine weather at 6 P. M. started the log no marks nothing in sight Lat 49° 25' N Long 22° 51' W

⁹⁴ Saturday 24th Com. with light wind from the S. W. and increasing at 5 P. M. came on to rain breeze increasing the ship on the North and Western tack took in Sail to double reef topsails still a Bailing Midday part light Gale from N. W. at 8 P. M. finish Bailing latter part fresh Gale from N. W. and fresh squalls of rain and wind at 10 P. M. parted the outer Bot stay took in all sail and the ship spoke before the notice met a Clarke came out of the Bore Pipe and made fast to the Bot stay and took the chain to the windlass and hoist it out Lat 50° 08' N

Aug 25th ⁹⁵ Monday 25th Com. with heavy Gale from N. W. and very heavy squalls of rain and wind at 1 P. M. more ship to the S. and Western at 3 P. M. set a close reef Main top sail at sun down the Gale moderated and Midday part light Gale and rain squalls ship on the South and Western tack latter part the same a number of Merchant Vessels in sight bound West Lat 49° 25' N Long 23° 02' W

⁹⁶ Tuesday 26th Com. with light Gale from N. W. the ship on the same Western tack at 1 P. M. more ship to the North Midday part light Gale from N. W. latter part heavy Gale from S. and plenty of rain and some heavy squalls the ship edged to under close reef Main top sail Main Tack on Sun

⁹⁷ Wednesday 27th Com. with fresh Gale from N. W. some rain at 4 P. M. more ship to the N. W. the Gale with N. W. by N. a heavy sea going Midday part fresh Gale from N. W. to N. W. and squalls latter part light Gale and heavy squalls of rain and wind saw a few Merchant Vessels Lat 48° 40' N Long 23° 28' W

⁹⁸ Thursday 28th Com. with fresh Gale from N. W. to N. N. W. the ship under double reef top sails and fore sail the most of the time on the Northern tack saw a number of Merchant Vessels Midday part fresh Gale from N. N. W. the ship on the Northern tack latter part the same Lat 48° 41' N Long 23° 54' W

⁹⁹ Friday 29th Com. with fresh Gale from the N. W. at 4 P. M. passing rain squalls the ship on the Northern tack under close reef top sails Midday part moderate sea and ship on the South and Western for Yellowback under double reef top sails and fore sail latter part light wind from N. N. W. and a heavy swell from N. W. a few passing rain squalls the fore and main masts employed in breaking out provisions in the after Hatch it quite pleasant for the Pass ship on the Northern tack Lat 48° 14' N
