 115 Sunday 14th Calm, with light breeze from North fine weather but a cloudy over cast the most of the time. Steering S.W. the watch employed in washing ship out side and other work saw 2 Merchant Ketches bound N.W. by N. and latter part light breeze from N to S.W. the ship on the Southern tack at 9 A.M. passed a part of weather and a old pick sent a boat to it to get some fish but did not get but one they came to by ship Lat 41° 42' N Long 33° 07' W

116 Monday 15th Calm, with light breeze from N.W. by N. the ship on the Southern tack under all sail the weather fine pleasant weather caught a Porpoise Midale and latter part wind from N.W. by N. steering S.W. by S. fine pleasant weather the watch employed in various work saw nothing the Starboard sick of duty Lat 40° 03' N Long 32° 30' W

117 Tuesday 16th Calm, with light breeze from the N.W. by N. steering S.W. by S. 4 P.M. saw the Island of Flores distant 50 miles bearing by compass S.E. by S. Midale part light breeze from N.E. at 9 P.M. heaved to the wind on the Western tack latter part light breeze from N.E. at daylight saw the Island from Flores bearing by compass S.E. by E made all sail and steamed for the Island so wind light breeze from N.E. Lat 39° 20' N Long 37° 07' W

118 Wednesday 17th Calm, with light breeze from N.E. the ship under all sail working to the North end of Flores to Point delgada Midale and latter part wind from N.E. at 8 P.M. saw the boat and went on shore and saw this season and shall not write again until I leave the last port for a other cruise feeling well pleased with this seasons success

October 163 Friday 31st Calm, with light breeze and calm from all points of the compass at 3 P.M. sent up a new main course the ship working to the Southward Midale and latter part light breeze from N to S.W. the ship on the Eastern tack and out clothing to the two men Lat 34° 40' N Long 16° 03' W

165 Sunday 22nd Calm, with light breeze from N.W. by N. the ship on the Southern tack under all sail the weather fine pleasant weather caught a Porpoise Midale and latter part wind from N.W. by N. steering S.W. by S. fine pleasant weather the watch employed in various work saw nothing the Starboard sick of duty Lat 40° 03' N Long 32° 30' W

166 Monday 23rd Calm, with light breeze from N.W. by N. the ship on the Southern tack under all sail the weather fine pleasant weather caught a Porpoise Midale and latter part wind from N.W. by N. steering S.W. by S. fine pleasant weather the watch employed in various work saw nothing the Starboard sick of duty Lat 40° 03' N Long 32° 30' W
