 Dec 11 1879
 195 Tuesday 2^d Con. with fine wind from N.E.
 the Bk by the rainier growing to the rainier warm
 after the Whales at 1 P.M. took up the Bk but
 still have hopes of seeing the Whales again before sun
 down at 6 P.M. see nothing of the whales gave them
 up and steamed N.W. by Middle and latter
 part fine wind from N.E. and pleasant the
 watch employed in tanning down and setting up
 Rigg Tauting St Boat also shifting sails Lat 17° 33' S
 Long 36° 58' W
 196 Wednesday 3^d Con. with fine breeze from N.E.
 and good weather Steering N.W. by S. The water
 calm and sailing down and setting up Rigg Tauting
 latter part light breeze from N.W. both steering the
 past a steam sailer out of steam ship steering N.E. the water
 ship became employed in tanning down Lat 20° 12' S
 Long 37° 05' W
 197 Thursday 4th Con. with light gales from N. steaming
 N.W. by S. by compass clouds over east the watch
 employed at various parts of the Rigg Middle
 part at 7 P.M. wind moderated in a rain squall
 and shifted gradually to the South. some squally the
 Bk. on Eastern tack Latter part light wind from
 the South and good weather some clouds the ship
 on the South and Western tack Lat 21° 04' S
 198 Friday 5th Con. with wind and good weather
 some clouds the Bk. on the S. and Western tack the
 watch employed in the Rigg Middle part strong
 wind from N.W. on the Bk. on the S. tack Latter part
 light wind from S.E. steering N.W. by S. the Bk. in sight
 think it is the "Hurry" over Bk Lat 21° 54' S
 Long 39° 14' W
 199 Saturday 6th Con. with fine breeze from E. Steering N.W. by S.
 Spinnaker at 6 P.M. four four boats for Spinnaker the boats
 came out going quick and light came on and not get away at 7 P.M.
 on the Bk. spoke the Bk. "Hurry" and headsail. Middle
 and latter part fresh wind from N.E. steering the
 Bk. on the S. tack the Bk. in company Lat 23° 38' S
 Long 40° 55' W

Overboard Passage South from Currieffe Canary Islands

 200 Sunday 7th Con. with fresh breeze from N.E. steering
 N.W. by S. the Bk. in company at 4 P.M. bent the Bk. on the
 sail Middle part the same cloudy over east Latter
 part strong wind from N.E. the Bk. in sight Lat 25° 49' S
 201 Monday 8th Con. with strong breeze from N.W.
 steering N.W. by S. the weather looking greatly and
 unpleasant Middle part light air from N.W. steering
 the same Latter part light breeze from N.W. the Bk. in sight
 Merchant brig in sight steering to the South and N.W.
 was at 10 P.M. was a dead Whale and found
 it to be a good Spinnaker Whale at 11 P.M. took it along
 the Bk. and was a good ready to cut him Lat 27° 12' S
 Long 41° 50' W
 202 Tuesday 9th Con. with light wind from the
 N.W. at 1 P.M. commenced to cut at 3 P.M. found
 cutting as it was a cow Whale and from all appearance
 was trying to give birth to her young but the
 calf was heavier the wrong way and the flukes was
 all rotten and gone and the information set in and killed
 the Whale at 7 P.M. started the two works Middle
 part light wind strong N.W. by S. boiling good weather
 Latter part fresh breeze from N.W. ship on the E.
 tack at 9 P.M. finish boiling at 11 P.M. tacked ship
 to the Westward with a heavy swell Lat 28° 08' S
 Long 42° 11' W
 203 Wednesday 10th Con. with fresh breeze from S.E. and
 working cutting heavy swell from N.W. the Bk. on the S.
 and Western tack at 4 P.M. sent down the old main sail
 and commenced to sail on Merchant Brig bound North
 Middle part light wind from E. steering N.W. by S.
 a heavy swell from N.W. Latter part fresh breeze
 from E.N.E. steering the same saw 1 Merchant
 vessel bound South the watch employed in the
 Rigg Tauting the main Bk. and halting Lat 29° 10' S
 Long 43° 23' W
