 290 Saturday 6th Com. with light Gale from N. E. W
 the ship on opposite tack clear weather saw white
 water at 3 P. M. more ship for it but never see
 it a gaine Miacale part the same Latter part light
 rain from N. W. and heavy swell the night all sail
 round Merchant Bk. in sight being at this 24 hours
 a Merchant Ena with a calum the watch employed breaking out there
 Lat 46:26
 291 Sunday 7th Com. with calum at 1 P. M. sent a boat
 on board of the Merchant Middel found her to be
 the Bk. St. Mary 60 aged from N. York bound to
 Valparaiso Chile at sundown took in sail 80 fathoms
 of water Miacale part light Gale from N. E. & the
 ship on different tack Latter part fresh rain
 from N. W. at 8 A. M. 70 fathoms of water ship on
 the N. tack nothing in sight Lat 46:08 S
 Long 62:00 W
 292 Monday 8th Com. with light rain from N. W. the ship
 on different tack caught a Porpoise saw a Steam Ship
 bound N. Miacale part fresh Gale from the S. at 1 P. M.
 in the miacale watch more ship to the N. W. Latter
 part took in all sail but a main spencer it blowing very
 heavy and very heavy squalls with hail and rain
 the weather looking very bad and the rain pouring
 to the Eastward it very unpleasant
 293 Tuesday 9th Com. with a very heavy Gale from E &
 at 3 P. M. it moderated some and the mising
 the ship having like a duck Miacale part more ship
 to the N. E. it moderated some sail Latter part fresh
 Gale from E & to E & ship on the North and Eastern

 from N. W. and cloudy weather the ship on the same
 New Main Spencer tack Latter part fresh rain from N. W. the ship on
 the Southern tack still made some sail Lat 45:52 S

 298 Sunday 14th Com. with fine pleasant weather the ship
 on the Northern tack round N. W. under main top sail
 caught a Porpoise at 4 P. M. caught a Porpoise the weather looks
 threatening Miacale and Latter part fresh rain from N. W.
 to N. N. W. the ship steering different course Lat 45:35
 Long 59:44
 299 Monday 15th Com. with fresh rain from N. N. W.
 steering S. under easy sail see nothing Miacale part
 the same at sundown took in sail ship on the same N. W. tack
 Latter part fresh Gale from N. N. W. made some
 sail steering S. W. & caught a Porpoise Lat 46:23 S
