 fresh light wind from W and fine weather Latter part
 the same ship under all sail on the North tack
 the watch employed in storing of Betrix decks Lat 43° 23' S
 Long 59° 39' W
 352 Friday 7th Con. with light breeze from N. N. W. and N. N.
 Broke out Ship on the North tack at dark took in sail and more
 mollased ship to the Sana West ward fine pleasant weather Midale
 70 fathoms part the same Latter part fresh wind from W steering N by W
 and a north W fine weather saw a Merchant Sh. kind S Lat 42° 15' S
 Bk. down S Long 59° 11' W
 353 Saturday 8th Con. with fresh wind from W steering N by E
 Broke out 1/2 E at dark took in sail for the night Midale and Latter
 for board light air and calm in the night caught 46 fish with hook and
 caught 46 line beautiful weather but no Whales Lat 41° 42' S
 fish 53 fathoms Long 58° 30' W
 354 Sunday 9th Con. with light wind from N. N. W. and N. N.
 some rain beautiful weather but no Whales at dark took in sail
 caught 3 Midale and Latter part light wind from N. N. W. and
 fish 53 fathoms changeable weather some rain caught 3 fish Lat 41° 05' S
 90 fathoms Long 57° 13' W
 355 Monday 10th Con. with light wind from N. N. W. the
 some ship on opposite tacks some fog at dark took in some
 rain sail Midale part cloudy over cast some rain
 some light Latter part light wind and calm smoky weather
 smoky saw a plenty of Poppoia and a few Fairbacks a very
 weather dry time for the good Bk. Ocean it being about 5 miles
 since we saw the last Rite Whale may the kind Father
 over us all help us to go aright and a right is order
 to meet with good success in the earnest prayer of
