459 Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> Calm. with light airs from North and calm  
fine beautiful weather the Merchant Brigantine in sight  
bound South Middle part fine breeze N.E. steering N.W. by S. Lat 39° 25' S  
Glass falling part light Calm from N.E. steering N.W. Lat 39° 25' S  
29 1/10  
460 Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> Calm. with fresh Calm from North at 6 P.M.  
Calm with more ship to the East were ship laying to under close reef  
Main top sail some rain squalls and heavy swell Middle  
Glass - and Latter part the same wind N.W. and N.W. Lat 39° 25' S  
29 1/10  
461 Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> Calm. with fresh Calm N.W. but moderating  
some heavy swell ship on the Northern tack under close  
reef Top sails Middle part Moderate ship on Northern  
fresh Calm from N.W. Latter part light Calm N.W. ship on the  
Glass 29 1/10 Northern tack clear weather Lat 38° 58' S  
Long 48° 18' W  
462 Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> Calm. with fresh gales N.W. the ship on  
the Northern tack at 4 P.M. close reef the main top sail  
Middle part moderate made some sail Latter part  
fresh breeze N.W. ship on the Northern tack Lat 37° 46' S  
Glass 29 1/10 I saw a small Sperm Whale Long 48° 02' W  
463 Friday 27<sup>th</sup> Calm. with fresh breeze from N.W.  
N.W. the ship on the western tack wind increasing  
Middle part the same Latter part fresh gales N.W. and  
Glass 29 1/10 N.W. clear weather ship on Northern tack Lat 37° 27' S  
Long 49° 03' W  
464 Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> Calm. with fresh Calm from N.W. and  
N.W. ship on the Northern tack under close reef  
Middle part the same Latter part light breeze from the  
Glass 29 1/10 N.W. and calm heavy swell Lat 36° 04' S  
Long 49° 24' W  
465 Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> Calm. with light airs and calm and  
calm heavy swell at dark double reef the Top sail  
Middle part light Calm from E steering N.W. by compass  
light Calm under double reef top sails cloudy weather some  
lightning in the Westward Latter part fresh breeze from  
Glass 29 1/10 East by the ship on the Northern tack a heavy swell and  
most part of the time cloudy ship under easy sail saw a  
Turtle and some Finbacks may have  
Fortune sailed on the Ocean and saw some Whales Lat 34° 55' S  
Long 50° 17' W

466 Monday 30<sup>th</sup> Calm. with fresh breeze from E the ship on  
fresh breeze Northern tack under easy sail saw a few Finbacks and  
from E part of clouds the most of the time Middle and Latter  
Glass 29 1/10 part the same watch employed in Repairing Lat 34° 33' S  
467 Tuesday 31<sup>st</sup> Calm. with light breeze from Eastward  
the area Calm rain in squalls thick cloudy weather the  
Glass 29 1/10 most of the time the ship on the Northern tack Middle  
and Latter part fresh breeze from the N.W. steering N.E. by hand  
N.E. fine clear weather saw Finbacks and 1 Merchant Lat 33° 24' S  
Long 49° 27' W  
468 Wednesday Aug 1<sup>st</sup> September Calm. with fresh breeze N.W. N.  
steering N.E. by hand N.E. at sundown took in some sail for  
the night Middle and Latter part light light breeze from N.W. to N.  
Cut his haws steering N.E. saw plenty of Finbacks Lat 31° 46' S  
Long 47° 15' W  
469 Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> Calm. with light Calm from N.W. to N.W. steering  
N.E. and N.E. clear pleasant weather saw Finbacks Middle  
and Latter part light breeze from N.W. to N.W. steering N.E.  
Glass 29 1/10 saw a number of Finbacks Beautiful weather Lat 30° 53' S  
Long 45° 11' W  
470 Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> Calm. with light breeze N.W. steering E by N fair  
beautiful weather saw a Merchant vessel bound North  
Middle Latter part light Calm from N.W. ship on N. tack Lat 30° 56' S  
Long 45° 30' W  
471 Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> Calm. with light Calm N.W. the ship on Western  
tack Middle part the same Latter part calm and heavy rain  
squalls some thunder and lightning at 10 A.M. a Gale commenced from  
N.W. in one hour three courses into the N.W. the weather very  
Glass 29 1/10 unsettled and blowing a fresh Gale ship under close reef N.W. top sail  
472 Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> Calm. with light Calm N.W. and fresh squalls of rain  
the weather unsettled ship on the North and Western tack one Merchant  
Saw a North. Brig. in sight on the North and Western tack Middle part the same  
Brig. bound Latter part light Calm from N.W. and a few passing rain squalls  
steering N.W. by N with a very heavy swell from N.W. the ship  
Glass 29 1/10 under double reef top sails saw a few Finbacks and one  
Turtle a dreadful low sun day from sunset house bit over  
so humble there is no place like home may know fortune smile  
on the broad Bk. Ocean and give her a Whale Lat 30° 22' S
