495 Tuesday 28th Com. with strong breezes from N.E. the ship more made on opposite tacks much sickness damp weather and no signs of a change Middle and Latter part the same

496 Wednesday 29th Com. with light rain from all points of sun a small compass and squalls of rain Middle part the same Latter part light breezes from S.W. by steering N.E. Lat 30° 12' S

497 Thursday 30th Com. with light breezes from S.W. by steering N.E. cloudy weather Middle part the same at 9 P.M. 9 o'clock Francis a boatsteward since made been sick ever since we left Montserrat with the Liver complaint I think Latter part light rain from S.W. and good weather Lat 29° 24' S Long 47° 09' W

498 Friday 1st Com. with light rain from S.W. steering N.E. arrival N.E. fine weather at 4 P.M. Berried the corpse a very solemn time at sea may kind heaven grant that I never will have the duty to perform again at sea is my earnest Prayer Middle part light rain and cloudy Latter part fresh rain from the N.E. and S.E. with rain ship on the N.W. tack rainy weather

499 Saturday 2nd Com. with light gales from the N. and rain the ship on the E. tack at sundown cleared off rain and steering N. blowing fresh Middle part fresh gales from S.W. at midnight ship luffed to the wind on the Western tack Latter part fresh gales S.W. with rain Lat 27° 49' S Long 47° 42' W

500 Sunday 3rd Com. with fresh gales S.W. ship on the N.W. tack carrying all polacant sail trying to hold on to the Southward praying for better weather Middle and clear fresh Latter part rain at 12 o'clock more ship off shore the latter Lat 27° 19' S Long 47° 04' W

501 Monday 4th Com. with fresh gales S.W. ship on the Eastern tack Middle and Latter part rain from S.W. a heavy swell the ship on the Western tack the most of the time Lat 11 A.M. very light air from S.W. the latter distant about 15 miles to the West of us or N.W. by the Island of Arvoredo at 2 o'clock calm Lat 27° 17' S Long 48° 04' W

502 Tuesday 5th Com. with light air from E. and calm and heavy sea from South pleasant weather no chance of making port to day. Since Providence please favor us with good weather beautiful and a chance tomorrow is my earnest Prayer Middle part light breeze from N.E. and beautiful weather ship on short tacks Latter part light rain and S.W. at daylight made all sail steering N.E. the latter in sight distant 30 miles saw two turtles at noon the Island Arvoredo distant 3 miles Lat 27° 16' S

503 Wednesday 6th Com. with fine rain from N.W. at 1 P.M. passed the Island of Arvoredo at 3 P.M. came to anchor in Five Fathom of water the Port bearing by compass N by E 44 miles distant so I shall stop writing this book until we leave this Port

504 Sunday 17th Com. with light rain from the Eastward at half past 2 P.M. rain N.W. at half past 2 P.M. took the Anchor and 2 P.M. took made all sail rain falling from N.W. to S.W. at 6 P.M. the Island of Arvoredo bearing North a fine breeze from N.W. steering E by N and at 9 P.M. the rain light Middle part at midnight to sea with fresh breeze from N.W. steering E at 4 A.M. the Port Rope of the 32 all torn fore top sail parted again Latter part fresh gales from N.W. steering S.S.E. at 8 A.M. took the two masts out of the ship and sent them to duty they feeling much better Lat 28° 00' S Long 46° 15' W

505 Monday 18th Com. with light gales from N.W. and N.E. S.S.E. clear weather and very drying weather Middle and rain squalls Latter part fresh gales from N.W. at 7 P.M. took in fore sail fresh gales and fore top sail ship have too much close Reef many top sail some squalls of rain a heavy sea running Lat 28° 25' S Long 45° 48' W

506 Tuesday 19th Com. with fresh gales from N.W. the ship laging too on the Southward tack some squalls of rain and light rain rain at sundown moderated with Middle part light rain and calm and a heavy swell running from S.W. made all sail Latter part light breeze from N.W. steering S at 4 o'clock weather A.M. commenced taking the Irish Potatoes on deck to sprout picking over fine pleasant weather rain and rain but nothing in sight may kind Fortune smile on the Ocean and sun Lat 28° 53' S Long 45° 24' W
