 weather took in sail Middle calm's heavy swell Latter part light
 good weather wind from S W to N Beautiful weather Lat 46° 35' S
 Long 54° 45' W
 591 Monday 3rd Calm. with light winds from N to N. N. W and
 Beautiful weather steering different courses see nothing but
 weather Furbacks Middle and Latter part fine breezes N. N. W and N W and
 Clear beautiful weather ship on the S and Western tack Lat 47° 35' S
 the Bk. Long 55° 40' W
 592 Tuesday 4th Calm. with fine breezes N. N. W the ship on the S and

 Stone Pipe Whales lower boats at half past seven o'clock at 15 minutes past
 Butter 8 P.M. the Larkara Boat struck at 10 P.M. in the Middle part
 Spinn Water took him along side at half past 11 P.M. set the watch Latter part
 Boat struck at 5 A.M. commenced to cut no wind light from N. N. W to N W &
 cutting thick fog the most of the time and very smooth sea Beautiful

 593 Wednesday 5th Calm. with light winds from N W some fog at 5
 Beautiful P.M. finish cutting at 7 P.M. finish laying the case and hoist it
 weather at 8 P.M. finish over board at 8 P.M. set the watch Middle part some fog the
 cutting watch employed in cutting Sunk Latter wind a ship on the
 Boiling Western tack Boiling strong breezes and clear Lat 47° 30' S
 Long 56° 40' W
 594 Thursday 6th Calm. with fresh winds North ship on the M
 Boiling tack backing at 5 P.M. took in sail for the night clear weather
 light sails Middle and Latter part light sails from N. N. W ship on
 the Eastern tack Boiling clear weather see nothing Lat 47° 33' S
 595 Friday 7th Calm. with light sails N. N. W and some fog
 Boiling the ship on the South & Western tack Boiling Middle and
 Fog Latter part the same at 10 A.M. finish boiling the the fog
 clearing at 9 A.M. nothing in sight ship under easy sail
 Whales recovered up from 114 barrels Lat 47° 30' S
 Boiling is hoped to throw down one humana barrel Long 56° 23' W
