

Remarks Pass On Board T.B. Ocean N. Bedford Co Whaling  
July 1881

596 Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> Calm. with fine rain from N.N.W. and a good  
light weather steering different courses see nothing Middle part  
the same Latter part light Calm N the wind blowing  
to the ship on opposite tack Lat 47° 45' S  
Long 55° 56' W

597 Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> Calm. with light Calm from N to N.W.  
Started the ship on Northward tack under easy sail employed in starting  
H. Oil in the tank Middle and Latter part fresh Calm  
from N to N.W. some rain squalls Lat 46° 53' S  
Long 55° 37' W

598 Monday 7<sup>th</sup> Calm. with moderate Calm from N and a  
heavy swell at 3 P.M. more ship to the Southward under easy  
sail saw a vessel called it a Whaler Middle and Latter  
part light rain from the N.W. at 4 A.M. commenced to  
bake but to stop Oil in main Hatch fair weather Lat 47° 06'  
Long 55° 37' W

599 Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> Calm. with fine breeze from N to N.W. ship on  
the Southward tack at 3 P.M. finish stowing Oil and commenced  
to break out water at sundown took in sail Middle and  
Latter fresh rain from N.N.W. cloudy and rainy weather  
No Sun

600 Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> Calm. with light Calm from S to South and  
rain squalls ship on the N.W. Middle and Latter part  
the same ship on opposite tack Lat 47° 20' S  
Long 56° 35' W

601 Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> Calm. with light Calm from S to ship on  
opposite tack Middle and Latter the same Lat 47° 00' S  
Long 56° 00' W

602 Friday 11<sup>th</sup> Calm. with fresh Calm from S to S.W. with  
rain squalls at 2 P.M. raised four Spirit Whales close to  
the ship going N.E. very slow ship on opposite tack Middle  
and Latter the same Lat 46° 50' S  
Long 55° 50' W

603 Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> Calm. with moderate Calm from S.W. to  
S.W. some squalls of rain ship on opposite tack under close  
reef main top sail and storm stay sails Middle and  
Latter part the same but not so squally the weather  
improving on the hole see nothing watch employed in  
Picking over Potatoes Lat 46° 20' S  
Long 56° 09' W

July 1881  
603 Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> Calm. with light Calm from S to S.W. under  
some sail ship on opposite tack Middle the same some rain  
in squalls Latter strong rain from N ship on the Southward  
tack under double reef top sails & courses Lat 46° 31' S  
Long 56° 09' W

604 Monday 14<sup>th</sup> Calm. with fresh rain N.W. steering S.W.  
S. & E. cloudy weather and unsettled at sundown took in sail  
Middle part rain light Latter light air and calm and  
a thick fog of the Starboard and Chok head a rather squally  
look and the Starboard Forward in the Forecastle to cool of some  
Lat 47° 08' S

605 Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> Calm. with fresh rain S.W. S.W. heavy  
small cloudy and unpleasant weather took in sail  
from Forward for a Starboard Middle and Latter part fresh  
Calms from S to S.W. and rain in squalls Lat 47° 16' S  
Long 56° 04' W

606 Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> Calm. with moderate Calm from S to S.W. and  
at 3 P.M. moderate some made some sail Middle and  
Latter part fresh Calm S to S.W. with rain squalls unpleasant  
Lat 47° 29' S

607 Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> Calm. with fresh Calm S.W. and rain squalls  
ship on opposite tack Middle and Latter part fresh Calm  
from S to S.W. and rain squalls Lat 47° 20' S  
Long 55° 31' W

608 Friday 18<sup>th</sup> Calm. with fresh Calm S.W. some squalls and  
a high sea running Middle and Latter part fresh Calm from  
S to S.W. with quite heavy squalls and some rain in them  
Lat 46° 54' S

609 Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> Calm. with fresh Calm from S.W. some  
squalls of rain and some ship on the Northward  
tack a very high sea running Middle and Latter moderate  
Calms from S to S.W. and Met ship on opposite tack Lat 46° 52' S  
Long 56° 02' W

610 Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> Calm. with light Calm N ship on Southward  
tack Middle and Latter light Calm from N.W. the ship on  
opposite tack the weather squally not very good seeing  
but no whale weather - Cloudy times it has been  
a Gale of rain now for about 10 weeks and no chance  
to see any thing let alone catching any thing Lat 47° 29' S  
Long 55° 35' W
