

Remarks on Board Bk. Ocean N. Bedford and Whaling Voyage  
March 1881

671 Friday 25<sup>th</sup> Com. with fair breeze from N.W. ship on the North and  
Eastward tack under all sail at dark took in some sail Middle part  
light wind from N.W. ship on opposite tack Latter part light wind  
from N.W. and calm at 1 A.M. sent the Fore top sail down for repairs  
saw a small boat bound N supposed it to be a Whale ship Lat 41° 25' S  
Long 57° 10' W

672 Saturday 26<sup>th</sup> Com. with light air from N to N.W. ship on the North  
and Eastward tack Middle light wind from N.W. and steering N.E. and caught  
100 Fish Latter part light wind from N.W. and E. Beautiful weather  
at 4 P.M. ship on the South Northward tack under all sail Lat 40° 32' S  
Long 56° 25' W

673 Sunday 27<sup>th</sup> Com. with light wind from E. and E. ship on the  
Northward tack Beautiful weather Middle light wind from E. and  
brought caught E. and N.W. a few passing rain squalls Latter part light wind from  
N.W. steering N.E. by N. Beautiful weather saw Fairbanks Lat 39° 30' S  
Long 55° 11' W

674 Monday 28<sup>th</sup> Com. with light wind from N steering N.E. by N  
Hump back at 3 P.M. had a shift of wind to the N.W. a rain squall at 4 P.M.  
steering N.E. and Middle fresh Gale S.W. Latter part the same  
steering N.E. and a boy & under all sail Lat 34° 02' S  
Long 53° 42' W

675 Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> Com. with light Gale S.W. steering N.E. and  
N.W. at 4 P.M. took in some sail steering N.W. at 8 P.M. took  
in sail and luffed to the wind Middle and Latter part  
fresh Gale S.W. and N.W. ship on the N. tack Lat 35° 22' S  
Long 54° 04' W

676 Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> Com. with fresh Gale N.W. ship on the  
Northward tack at 2 P.M. raised the main land bearing Cape St.  
Maria and Lopez Island distant 12 leagues Middle at  
4 P.M. more ship of shore Maldonado Light bearing N.W. 15  
miles took in the Fore sail fresh Gale S.W. with very heavy squalls  
Latter part the same the squalls not so heavy Lat 35° 08' S  
Long 53° 04' W

677 Thursday 31<sup>st</sup> Com. with fresh Gale from N.W. to S.W. the  
ship on the Southward Eastward tack Middle the same Latter  
part moderate some rain still in the south and Western  
squalls ship on the Northward tack a heavy swell from S.E. &  
saw one vessel bound to the Northward eastward Lat 35° 04' S  
Long 52° 44' W

678 saw a whaler  
again. I am sick and tired of the sea  
sent down the Cross Mast

On Her Passage From the Banks to Montevideo 1881  
April 1881

678 Friday 1<sup>st</sup> Com. with light Gale from S.W. and S.W. ship on  
the Southward Eastward tack a heavy swell from S.E. & the weather  
unsettled Middle fresh breeze from S.W. and light breeze also  
light wind at 3 A.M. more ship to the Westward Latter part light wind  
from S.W. and S.W. ship on the Northward Western tack Lat 34° 56' S  
Long 52° 30' W

679 Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> Com. with light air S.W. ship on the Northward  
Western tack saw 1 Merchant Bk. bound Northward Middle calm  
and light wind from E. and steering N.W. by W Latter part  
light wind North steering N.W. by S at 4 P.M. spoke a Pilot boat  
from Montevideo fine beautiful weather Lat 30° 08' S  
Long 54° 15' W

680 Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> Com. with light wind N.E. steering N at 3 P.M.  
raised the land near Lopez Island at 4 P.M. beat the channel  
and put anchor of the River at 6 P.M. came to anchor of  
a part of the City in 3 and a half fathoms of water and  
furled the sails at 8 P.M. came on to rain in squalls  
weather unpleasant so ended this sojourn until the  
ship leaves Montevideo bound on shore after lots of letters

May 1<sup>st</sup> Friday 20<sup>th</sup> Com. with light air N at sundown Flores  
Islands bearing N.W. distant 12 miles at 9 P.M. calm  
Left Flores dropped the anchor took in light sails Middle part  
calm at 3 A.M. took anchor made all sail wind N.W. steering  
N.E. & E. Latter light wind from N.W. steering the same saw  
5 sail bound E. and W. Lat 30° 22' S  
Long 54° 30' W

678 Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> Com. with light wind from N.W. to  
the land N steering E. & E. and E by N at sundown light air and  
fast in calm part saw 8 ship in spate in salt water & sail  
sight 8 or 9 in sight Middle and Latter part light wind steering E by N same  
saw 8 or 9 cloudy saw 8 or 9 main top sail braces No sail  
Main top sail

679 Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> Com. with fine wind from N.W. to  
S.W. steering E. & E. saw a few passing vessels bound  
Prisoner in Southward North Middle and Latter part the same  
the land for  
on his way  
behavior Lat 34° 33' S  
Long 49° 57' W
