949 Friday 18th Com. with light airs and calms the ship
under the lee of St. Antoine Island at 3 P.M. the boat
came on board with one man all that was to be got
Middle & Latter part at 7 P.M. took the trais from
Islands & steering S by E at 10 A.M. raise the Islands of Pogo and
Pogo. Bravo Bravo distant 20 miles saw one bk. at Anchor

950 Saturday 19th Com. with strong trais from E ship
of and on Bravo at 1 P.M. boat went on shore to ship
3 men at sundown the boat came on board Middle
On on ship of and on Latter at 9 A.M. sent boat on shore again

951 Sunday 20th Com. with very strong trais at 6 P.M.
left the boat came on board and we began by to Bravo
shipped too men all we could get Middle steering
S by E wind very misty Latter strong trais from
East steering S by E nothing in sight Lat 13° 38' N
Long 24° 35' W

952 Monday 21st Com. with strong trais from E steering
broke out S by E Middle the same Latter part fine trais N E
steering S by E see nothing Lat 11° 02' N
Long 23° 13' W

953 Tuesday 22nd Com. with fine trais N E steering
fine weather S by E Middle and Latter the same some clouds no
sun

954 Wednesday 23rd Com. with fine trais from N E steering
S by East see nothing may kind fortune saw some sperm
Whales along and give the Ocean a chance to get a good
cut out of them Middle and Latter the same at sundown
took in sail to double reef top sails Lat 6° 25' N
Long 21° 25' W

955 Thursday 24th Com. with fine trais N E & N E steering
S by N 1/2 N Middle at sundown took in sail some rain
in squalls thunder & Lightning Latter light airs S E to
N E ship on the northern tack Lat 6° 51' N
Long 20° 01' W

956 Friday 25th Com. with light trais E to N E some rain squ
at sundown took in some sail Middle and Latter part
light airs and calms some squalls of rain and thunder
squalls and Lightning plenty of small fish Lat 6° 41' N
Long 19° 41' W

Voyage In the Atlantic Ocean Bound South from Cape de Verde
November 1881
957 Saturday 26th Com. with light trais from N E some squalls
broke out of rain steering N by N at sundown took in sail Middle and
Latter calms cloudy over cast the most of the time Lat 6° 08' N
Long 22° 53' W

958 Sunday 27th Com. with light airs S and S W ship on Northern tack
Middle and Latter the same some rain and calms Lat 5° 48' N
Long 23° 28' W

959 Monday 28th Com. with light winds from E and calms and
rain squalls steering N by N Middle part light winds
Latter wind S E at 10 A.M. changed the course to S W a heavy
spell from the N saw a number of Merchant vessels going
both North and South saw a lot of Whale squid Lat 5° 30' N
Long 24° 24' W

960 Tuesday 29th Com. with light breezes from S E and a heavy
squall from the N saw a number of Merchant vessels South
Middle and Latter part the same wind from E to S steering
S by S and S W saw a number Merchant vessels Lat 4° 32' N
Long 24° 34' W

961 Wednesday 30th Com. with light breezes from E to S & ship
on the southern tack some squalls of rain saw 3 Merchant
vessels bound South Middle and Latter the same Lat 3° 26' N
Long 25° 02' W

962 Thursday 1st Com. with light trais from S E ship on
South and Latter tack under all sail a few falling rain
squalls Middle and Latter part fine trais S E & the ship
on the S and Latter tack some rain squalls saw two vessels
Lat 2° 01' N

963 Friday 2nd Com. with squally weather wind S E &
squalls the most of the time the ship on the S and Latter tack
Middle and Latter the same ship on the N tack Lat 1° 00' N
Long 27° 52' W

964 Saturday 3rd Com. with light trais S E & ship on the South
tack under all sail the weather looking squally Middle and
Latter the same saw Killers Lat 0° 00' N
Long 28° 51' W

965 Sunday 4th Com. with light trais S E & ship on the S
and Latter tack under all sail Middle and Latter part
some midlight airs from E S E. and S E ship on the Southern
tack some rain squalls Lat 0° 26' S
Long 29° 73' W
