 986 Sunday 25th bow. with fresh winds N.E. at 1 P.M. a three
 Boiling master's Sch. came aboard and took a good look at us a
 a man Bailing came at 2 P.M. finish cutting at 3 P.M. set the

 Boiling Latter part full winds N.E. steering different courses
 him a note at 6 A.M. a man fell overboard from a boat and save
 him all with no pain done Lat 29° 00' S

 991 Friday 30th bow. with light airs from N and N.W. steering S.W.
 stored at 6 P.M. finish stowing down Middle and latter part
 down. light airs from N and calms saw one sail Lat 33° 25' S
 Oil. 1 barrel Beef Long 47° 46' W
 992 Saturday 31st bow. with calms the watch employed in making
 the Eugene ship in side at 4 P.M. light winds S.E. steering S.W. Middle
 main part winds from the S & latter wind fresh from N.E. steering
 S.W. I saw the man that was taken out of the boat with the limb
 fearful very bad and I think mortification has taken place as
 he will die the flesh is all leaving the bone my God help him Lat 34° 52' S

 the sick man calms and squally weather the ship bound to Montevideo
 very bad off to take the Eugene man Middle and latter part light
 caught a airs and calms from all points of the compass Lat 34° 39' S

 994 Monday 2nd bow. with light airs and calms from all points
 mortification of the compass Middle and latter light calms saw a ship
 has taken part ship on the Western tank some rain squalls Lat 34° 20' S
 in the main Lat 32° 31' W
 995 Tuesday 3rd bow. with light gales from clear the ship
 Lat 32° 31' W on opposite tack the sick man much the same Middle the
 steering for same the ship on opposite tack Latter wind N.E. steering
 Montevideo & N.W. by N for Montevideo Lat 34° 45' S
 Long 52° 45' W
 996 Wednesday 4th bow. with fine breeze N.E. and N steering
 the sick man N.W. for Montevideo Middle at midnight the wind came out
 about the sudden to S.W. with thunder at lightning and rain Latter
 same fresh calms saw the land Cape St. Maria Lat 34° 39' S
 Long 53° 51' W
 997 Thursday 5th bow. with fresh calms S.E. the ship on the
 Broke out Eastern tank Middle the same Latter moraines made all
 Bread sail the wind on the land in sight the ship on the North and Western
 tack the sick man no better seems to be Lat 34° 14' S
 suffering a great deal Long 53° 20' W
