1102 Monday 29th Calm, with light Gale N.W. steering E and E. & E. under easy sail at sundown layed by Midea the same latter strong breeze N steering E. & E. Lat 36:23 Long 36:28

1103 Tuesday 30th Calm, with fresh breeze N and some squalls at sundown layed by Midea the same latter part fresh thought the wind at a heavy swell from N.E. at sundown raised a number of Whales in a school going to the ringward quick at first called them Spirit Whales but made sail and gave chase saw a number of Finbacks Lat 37:00 Long 36:47 W

1104 Wednesday 31st Calm, with fresh breeze N.W. ship on the Eastern tack the most of the time Midea and latter main top sails from N.W. to N. some rain steering to the North and East was the watch employed in stowing up the After hold to get water at 10 A.M. the main top sail broke down by the run and broke by the tie parting

1105 Thursday June 1st strong rain from N.W. to N and rain at 6 P.M. finish the After hold middle and latter masts the same thick fog some part of the time saw a few vessels Lat 39:17 N Long 38:41 W

1106 Friday 2nd Calm, with light wind & the ship on the Northward tack the watch employed in getting ready for water Midea and latter light airs and calms getting ready from Eastward employed in stowing up the Fore hold for water saw one Steam ship bound East Lat 39:18 N Long 33:47 W

1107 Saturday 3rd Calm, with calms at 3 P.M. finish the Fore hold and put a new Fore sail Midea light airs and calms latter masts from N.W. and thick hazy weather steering E. & E. 1/2 S no sun

1108 Sunday 4th Calm, with fresh wind N and rain and fog steering E. & E. 1/2 S this 24 hours was in going on shore at St. George's River Island for Letters and recruits

1117 Tuesday 13th Calm, with light airs from N.W. the boat on shore for the last time

1118 Wednesday 14th Calm, with light airs and calms at 1 P.M. the boat came off with the remaining part of Keenick's Midea and latter light airs and calms steering N.W. & employed in various jobs the Pelicans in sight a little rain in squalls Lat 39:48 N Long 31:02 W

1119 Thursday 15th Calm, with light airs from all points Floes in sight of the coluparts and called the Pelicans plane in sight light some rain squalls Midea and latter the same employed in drying Quins and Potatoes Lat 39:59 Long 31:02 W

1120 Friday 16th Calm, with calms employed in drying Quins Painting and Potatoes and Painting Starboard Boat Floes still Starboard in sight Midea calms latter light airs from E to S.E. Boat steering N.W. & beautiful weather Lat 40:26 N Long 31:24 W

1121 Saturday 17th Calm, with light airs from S.E. steering N.W. & the watch employed in Painting the Fore and main masts at 3 P.M. picked up a spruce plank Midea and latter the same saw quite a number of vessels bound N and Eastward the watch employed in Painting Lat 41:18 N Long 31:34 W

1122 Sunday 18th Calm, with light winds from E. & E. to South steering N.E. by N 1/2 N saw a number of Merchant Vessels bound North the watch employed in Painting and number of wetting Hole Midea and latter light winds from E to S. N.W. beautiful weather saw a number of vessels bound Eastward plenty of Porpoises and Finbacks Lat 42:26 Long 31:34 W

1123 Monday 19th Calm, with light breeze from N.W. steering Beautiful N.W. & saw a number of vessels bound E and Midea and latter light breeze from S.W. steering N.W. & saw a plenty of vessels bound to the Land Eastward and a plenty of Finbacks and Porpoises caught two Porpoises the ground looking very low by the watch employed in Painting some and various other jobs Lat 43:34 N Long 31:34 W
