

Remarks Pass On Board 73k. Ocean N. Bedford O. a.

July 1882
1152 Tuesday 18th Calm. with fresh S.W. with fresh squalls of rain and wind the ship laying to on the Southern tack under close reef main top sail Midland and Latter the same a few squalls saw 1 vessel Lat 48° 59' N Long 21° 51' W

1153 Wednesday 19th Calm. with moderate S.W. from N.W. area a heavy swell with light rain and cloudy at 4 P.M. were ship to the North Midland and Latter light S.W. from N.W. the ship on the Northern tack with some squalls of rain and wind unpleasant weather saw a few passing vessels Lat 49° 40' N Long 21° 45' W

1154 Thursday 20th Calm. with fresh S.W. from N.W. a heavy swell from N.W. the ship on the Northern tack saw nothing but Crabs and Porpoises Middle light falling wind S.W. and W. rain Latter calm and clear at 11 A.M. tried to put Latter on board of a Western bound steam ship but the Capt. was to much of a Hogg to stop Lat 50° 0' N Long 22° 10' W

1155 Friday 21st Calm. with calm employed in repairing the Fore Stay sail saw a number of Steam Ships and sailing vessels Middle fresh breeze S.W. with rain Latter fresh S.W. ship on opposite tack Lat 50° 10' N Long 22° 38' W

1156 Saturday 22nd Calm. with fresh S.W. ship on the Southern tack under close reef Top sails Middle and Latter the same a very uneven country Lat 49° 01' N Long 22° 58' W

1157 Sunday 23rd Calm. with fresh S.W. ship on the Southern tack at 4 P.M. a Merchant B.C. came along close to by the name of Christina bound to the South and Westward Middle the same Latter part moderated the wind N.W. made all sail ship on the Southern tack saw a few Porpoises and Finbacks a heavy swell from N.W. many kind Portence smile on the Good Bk. Ocean and God it his One more Whale is the anxious Prayer of Pilgrims Lure house sweet home how anxious I am to see you again Lat 48° 07' N Long 23° 50' W

1158 Monday 24th Calm. with fine breezes N.W. ship on the Northern tack saw plenty of Porpoises a heavy swell from N.W. Middle fresh S.W. and rain steering N.W. by N some rain Latter light S.W. from N.W. some rain caught a ship on the S.W. and Western tack at 11 A.M. a Steam Ship past bound N.W. caught a Porpoise Lat 48° 38' N Long 24° 30' W

1159 Tuesday 25th Calm. with light S.W. N.W. and light S.W. cloudy weather ship on the Northern tack a heavy swell from N.W. and rain Middle and Latter part light S.W. from N.W. and calm One sail in sight and a number of Steam Ships Lat 47° 45' N Long 25° 23' W

1160 Wednesday 26th Calm. with light S.W. steering N.W. by N the match employed in various (Bobolink) Steam Ship the Riggin Middle fresh S.W. and rain from S.W. steering N.W. by N Latter fresh S.W. the ship on the Northern tack at 6 A.M. passed a steamer suppose to be employed in laying a Telegraph cable Lat 48° 30' N Long 24° 43' W

1161 Thursday 27th Calm. with fresh S.W. the ship on the Northern tack saw a few steamers at 2 P.M. sent the Fly (D) in to repair cloudy over east the most of the time Middle and Latter strong S.W. ships on opposite tack saw a few vessels Lat 49° 15' N Long 28° 38' W

1162 Friday 28th Calm. with fresh S.W. steering fine wind N.W. under all sail saw a few vessels bound S.W. some rain the ship on the Western tack Latter part fine breezes from N.W. clear weather the ship on the Northern tack saw a few vessels

1163 Saturday 29th Calm. with fresh S.W. the ship on the Northern tack saw a plenty of Porpoises and Crabs Middle and Latter light air and calm from North same rain a cloudy over east the most of the time saw a plenty of Porpoises and a few vessels No Sun
