

Remarks Pass On Board 73<sup>rd</sup> Ocean New Bedford On 2<sup>nd</sup> Aug 1882

1164 Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> Com. with light winds & steering cloudy N by E. sun plenty of barpoises cloudy over east the weather most of the time Middle and Latter part fresh wind S W Fogg and rain the ship on the North and Western tack unpleasant weather No Sun

1165 Monday 31<sup>st</sup> Com. with fresh winds S W ship on the North and Western tack under double reef Top sails thick Fogg and rain Middle and Latter the same No Sun

1166 Tuesday 1<sup>st</sup> Com. with fresh winds from S W strong rain thick Fogg and rain the ship on the North and Western tack saw plenty of barpoises Fogg and rain Middle and Latter light air and calm calms thick Fogg and rain no sun

1167 Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> Com. with light air and calm rain and thick Fogg and rain Middle and Latter fresh Fogg and calm rain and plenty of rain and Fogg very unpleasant Lat 49.07 N

1168 Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> Com. with Gales from S and rain & Fogg ship on the Western tack at 4 P. M. round hauls to the S W and moored Middle and Latter part light air from N and calm the ship on the Northern tack Oil Leaking saw sail in sight bound Westward Lat. 49.35 N Long 42.50 W

1169 Friday 4<sup>th</sup> Com. with light air from N E some rain steering N. W. the watch employed in running across the Fore top Gallant Yard from the main and securing up at the foreward the main top Gallant Mast prob at 4 P. M. raised a large sperm Whale lowered 3 boats but did not catch him as he was working to the main track and it being bad weather Middle steering N. W. Middle first part fine breeze from N E and some rain steering N. W. at midnight light air and calm Latter the same fine weather the rain got the most of our clothing very sore & unpleasant at 11 A M round light from Lat 48.40 South ship on Western tack Long 42.54

Whaling Voyage in the Atlantic Ocean Bound West from New Bedford On 2<sup>nd</sup> Aug 1882

1170 Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> Com. with light breeze from S. E. and rain steering N. W. at 4 P. M. saw 7 humpbacks tried to make the sperm Whales but failed Middle and Latter light winds from S W to N. W. some rain and Fogg the ship on the North and Western tack the most of time at 9 A M the outer bobstay parted saw too vessels to sun

1171 Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> Com. with fresh winds S W ship on the North and Western tack with rain and Fogg. It very unpleasant weather Middle light winds N. W. ship on the Southern tack Latter the same thick Fogg and rain No Sun

1172 Monday 7<sup>th</sup> Com. with light winds from rain & Fogg the ship on the North and Western tack thick Fogg and rain unpleasant weather Middle and Latter light winds from North and calm some foggy steering S W by W Lat 46.53 Long 48.10

1173 Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> Com. with light air and calm some Fogg some foggy and rain saw one sail bound Westward Oil Leaking S W by W Middle and Latter light winds from S W to S N some foggy the watch employed in breaking out the Fore Hole to find the leak in the Oil and Pump to Rotterdam and filled other casks Lat 46.42 N Long 48.30 W

1174 Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> Com. with light winds S to S W some Fogg saw one brig bound Westward Middle and Latter part light winds N. W. thick Fogg the ship on the North and Western tack under all sail Lat 46.38 N

1175 Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> Com. with light winds N. E. W thick Fogg the ship on the North and Western tack under all sail Middle and Latter part the same at 8 A M tacked ship to the South and Eastward thick Fogg the most of the time by the look of the water think the ship on the North and Eastern edge of the Newfoundland Land Banks see nothing unpleasant weather
