1177 Saturday 12th Comm. with light winds N. and N. E. ship on the Southern tack thick Fog all of the time Middle and Latter the same ship on the Southern tack with clear beautiful weather saw a few vessels bound E. and W. Lat 44° 13' N Long 46° 15' W

1178 Sunday 13th Comm. with light winds N. E. ship on the Southern tack fine clear beautiful weather saw a few vessels bound Eastward Middle and Latter the same saw a plenty of vessels bound Eastward the most of them Briggantines Lat 42° 50' N Long 45° 40' W

1179 Monday 14th Comm. with light winds N. E. ship on the Southern and Eastern tack fine beautiful weather saw a plenty of vessels bound Eastward Middle and Latter fresh winds N. E. ship on S. and E. tack Lat 42° 00' Long 42° 40' W

1180 Tuesday 15th Comm. with light winds N. at 4 P.M. more ship to the North and N. E. Middle and Latter light winds from N. E. and N. W. some rain squalls at 11 more ship to the Southward Lat 42° 17' N Long 43° 10' W

1181 Wednesday 16th Comm. with light winds N. E. ship on opposite tack a few rain squalls Middle fresh winds N. E. W. with rain squalls ship on the North and Western tack Latter part light winds N. E. and a heavy swell from the N. W. the ship on the South and Western tack some cloudy weather see a few vessels Lat 42° 23' N Long 43° 16' W

W. the ship on fine winds the North and Western tack saw a number of vessels most saw a number of them bound Eastward Lat 42° 34' N Long 44° 50' W

1184 Saturday 19th Comm. with fine winds N. E. ship on the fine weather North and Western tack saw a number of vessels bound N. E. Eastward employed in lashing up the main top.
