

Remarks Pass On Board Bk. Ocean Mr Bedford On a. Whaling today

Aug 1882

1188 Wednesday 23rd Calm. with light winds & a heavy swell from S.W. the ship on the Eastern tack under all sail the main top Middle and Latter strong winds from S.W. a good ballast and weather ship on opposite tacks at 8 A.M. found the head of the Fore top mast badly sprung sent down Fore top mast the Fore top ballast mast and rigging to clean it as much as possible and put a Iron Bands on in the worst place and strengthen it as much as possible Lat 42° 48' N Long 46° 49' W

1189 Thursday 24th Calm. with fine winds and good weather sail at 2 P.M. set double reef top sails a large steam ship passed the Fore bow & Middle part the same Latter fresh winds top Mast S.W. and S.E. and squalls of rain unpleasant weather growing saw one vessel bound & ship under easy sail to favor ground at the Fore top mast it growing more real the time Lat 42° 10' N Long 48° 30' W

1190 Friday 25th Calm. with fresh winds and a heavy swell took up ship on the Western tack under easy sail the weather the sheathing was settled the class quite low took up the sheathing on the Port side of the deck Middle and Latter part Tight winds from S.W. to S.W. a heavy swell from W and S.W. some light rain squalls the ship on the North and Western tacks the most of the time Lat 41° 50' N Long 48° 54' W

1191 Saturday 26th Calm. with light winds from N.W. and light a heavy swell S.W. ship on the North and Western tack saw some steam ship bound W Middle and Latter light rain squalls from N.W. the winds from N.W. to S.W. the ship on the North and Western tack Lat 41° 03' N Long 49° 05' W

1192 Sunday 27th Calm. with light winds S.W. the ship on the Western tack saw a few vessels bound Eastward some rain squalls mild and steady Middle part Thunder winds from S.W. to N.W. and fresh squalls of rain & lightning with Thunder and Lightning ship on the North and Western tack Latter part light airs and calms a heavy swell saw a few vessels bound Eastward

On the North and South Atlantic Ocean Bound Home

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1193 Monday 28th Calm. with light airs and calms Heavy calms and swell took vessels in sight Middle and Latter light airs rain squalls and calms a few light rain squalls from the South and taking up Westward a heavy swell the most of the time and a number of vessels bound Eastward and a few steam ships Lat 41° 01' N

1194 Tuesday 29th Calm. with light airs and calms a few rain squalls from the South and Westward saw a number of vessels bound Eastward Middle strong winds N.W. and fresh squalls with rain ship on South and Western tack Latter part winds from N.W. a few rain squalls the ship on the South and Western tack a heavy swell from S.W. a number of vessels in sight bound Eastward Lat 42° 42' N Long 50° 09' W

1195 Wednesday 30th Calm. with light winds N.W. the ship on the South and Western tack saw a few vessels bound Eastward and one vessel bound Westward at sundown calms Middle fine winds from N.E. and rain steering N the first fair winds of any account during the Passage from Cape Morris Brown. Latter part Calms from N.W. some rain squalls steering N saw a few vessels plenty of Skip Jacks Lat 39° 35' N Long 52° 46' W

1196 Thursday 31st Calm. with light Calms N steering N.W. a few rain squalls Middle and Latter part fresh winds from N.E. some rain steering N.W. by N by N.W. a thick over cast of clouds no sun nothing in sight to see

1197 Friday September 1st Calm. with light baffling winds and rain saw some ship Middle and Latter part Beautiful light winds from North steering N.W. fine pleasant weather see nothing. some swell home Lat 39° 34' N Long 56° 30' W

1198 Saturday 2nd Calm. with light breezes from North and N.W. the ship on the Western tack Middle and Latter part light baffling winds with squalls of rain and unpleasant the ship on different tacks Lat 39° 03' N
